Dear Kuranda Paper,

Following last month's letter to the Kuranda Paper, the campaign by objectors to stop the establishment of the live ammunition 'shooting gallery' has gained tremendous support from across the community. This confirms our belief that initial rejection of the shooting gallery would have been overwhelming if only the community had been aware of the proposal. Even with limited pre-publicity the rally on Saturday October 18th attracted over fifty protesters, including both local State Member Lyn Warwick MLA and Dr. Lesley Clark, the Labour candidate for Barron River. And after only three weeks and limited circulation the petition already has several hundred residents signatures.

The legal action itself is proceeding. Eleven residents lodged a notice of appeal against Council's decision on Friday 17th October in the Land and Environment Court. It is important to understand that this does not remove any sort of "approval" or "permission" for the developer to proceed as the developer has never had any "approval". All the developer has ever had is a notice of intent to approve from Council *subject to no appeal being lodged and all conditions being met.*

There have been several attempts to discredit the objection by inferring that information is false. Clearly, given the legal action, the objectors have been very careful to ensure the information is correct. All information regarding the operation of the shooting gallery contained in both last months letter and on every sheet of the petition is copied directly from the developer's own application and from Council correspondence. These attempts seek to distract attention from the real issue. That is, that a majority of Mareeba Shire Councillors ignored the rights of residents focussing only on a promise of tourism dollars, and in doing so ignored the Council's own town planning instruments. The inappropriateness of a shooting gallery being established right in the very 'heart' of the Village is cause for great concern regarding Council's ability to responsibly control development.

The legal process is time consuming and expensive and we need your support. If we spread the load we, as a community, can be effective. A bank account for contributions has been established at the Kuranda Branch of the Northern Building Society (a/c no. 4391063 S2). This is only to cover actual legal costs. All other costs such as phone, copying etc. are being borne personally by the objectors and others in the community. You can also support the action by signing the petition at the Greenhouse, the Newsagency and the Vet. and by making others aware of the action.

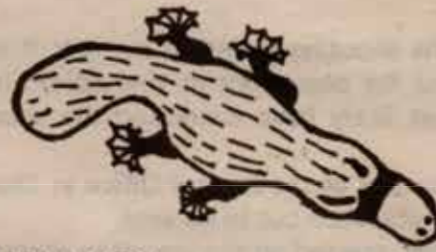

1. **KURANDA HIGH SCHOOL:** welcome to Principal Jenny Jensen.
2. **KURANDA LIBRARY & COMMUNITY CENTRE:** As Council starts on the refurbishment of the former Grogan house on Thoree Street, which will serve as an interim library, Council office and community meeting room until the final facility is constructed adjacent, Mareeba Shire librarian Francis Utzinger will bring us up to date with the results of the library survey (which received a very strong response from Kuranda). Francis will also be seeking feedback and guidance from residents regarding hours of operation etc. ARK will also facilitate the formation of a library working group at this meeting. With changes to council funding and priority works, it is vital that the community takes a more active role in ensuring these long overdue facilities are achieved, as well as pursuing a more effective library service NOW!
3. **OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATION:** With a number of proposals coming up and with the KVPP Le Page Marketing & Promotion Plan recommending the development of overnight accommodation in the Kuranda area as a priority, it is timely for residents to consider these proposed developments and their implications, especially to residential areas. ARK is recommending Council take a 'wholistic' approach when considering overnight accommodation in the Kuranda area. We will review the current situation and discuss the establishment of guidelines regarding overnight accommodation.
4. **KURANDA HERITAGE 'THEME PARK':** This proposal to establish a 'theme park' on Rob Veivers Drive incorporating a number of parcels of land including the Railway Heritage Centre [Ex-Big Tomato], adjacent Heritage Settlement and Butterfly Sanctuary as well as Birdworld and land backing onto Morton Street settlement received significant opposition when it was mooted last year. Following the KVPP Le Page Marketing & Promotion Plan recommendation that a 'themed' attraction be developed, the project has been re-activated and the Kuranda Village Promotion Program management committee is working with the developer on guidelines and strategies to improve upon the initial concept and hopefully agree upon a development which may be more acceptable to the wider community both in terms of product environmental impacts. The focus is nature-based attractions. The developer has been invited to outline the current status of the project and meet with residents.

Some issues arising from the October meeting:

**BARRON GORGE LOOKOUT:** A last minute presentation by Steve Collins and Doug Wilson from the Department of Environment was prompted by concerns from *within the Department and the Mareeba Shire Council* regarding works planned to upgrade the Barron Gorge Lookout area. ARK has been involved for a number of years with DE, trying to ensure least possible damage to the area as the works program continues. Barron Falls National Park, with the highest visitation rate in Queensland, is now receiving funding from a number of sources including Q-Rail, Skyrail and the Mareeba Shire Council (\$100,000 over three years sourced from the Kuranda Tourist Levy) as well as government funding.

One of the main components of the work at the Lookout is provision of parking and this was the area of concern raised by Steve and Doug. As they explained, although planning had been based on a design to minimise of clearing related to providing parking when it actually came time to translate plans into action it had become obvious that the design would actually cause more damage than previously thought. With work due to start within weeks DE had come back to the community and Council for further consultation.

Following two on-site meetings, a revised plan has been drawn up to accommodate parking for 36 cars and 3 'coasters' (no large coaches allowed). The new design will incorporate wheelchair access to the boardwalk, a small interpretive facility with some seating. The new plan now concentrates clearing only in the area under the existing powerline with no clearing of the loop road and a low key approach to drainage ie. no kerb and channel.

The revised plans will be available for inspection at the November 19th ARK meeting.

**ADVISORY COMMITTEE:**

**Information Centre:** Council has indicated its intention to call for expressions of interest for a tourist information centre to be established in the 'foyer' area of the Centenary Park amenities block. ARK has raised concern that the centre is really a service and not just a commercial outlet which would compromise the integrity of the park as a haven and public space. It is even possible that the community through a consortium of service organisations could run the facility itself, as happens elsewhere. Are there any organisations interested in this idea? If so can you please contact ARK through PO Box 573 or one of the contacts below.

### KURANDA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE & TOURISM INC

Report from Meeting held 5th September 1997  
The Chamber meets the first Monday each month at the Kuranda Sports & Social Club, 7.00pm  
Cr Chris Lewis and Ned Brischetto attended this meeting and the new development of Coondoo Street was discussed. Cr Lewis confirmed that works would be carried out between 2.30pm and 11.30pm so as not to have too much impact on businesses. All the plans containing information on the development are available for viewing at the Council Office in Thongon Street. Discussion continued with the ongoing problem of traders tables, goods and signs on the pavements. Cr Lewis said that Council would be employing a regular parking officer who will be able to police the Council laws. KVPP approached the Chamber requesting support in retaining telegraph poles in Coondoo Street and getting a local artist to carve them. Chamber suggested looking at alternative uses for the poles as well. Sohail Laghaifar addressed the meeting in response to questions about the proposed shooting gallery in The Ark. He explained that the gallery was a safe, tourist oriented facility, would bring more tourists to the village and would encourage them to stay in the village longer. The shooting gallery would also be in a closed off area to the rest of the development.

Dear Kuranda Paper,

I know how irritating it can be when a "foreigner" comes into your town and criticises it. So, let me say at the outset, that after spending a week in Kuranda I really like the village, those of its people I have met, and most of the development which has taken place since I was last here in 1985. However I cannot leave without having my say about two developments which, in my opinion, are tantamount to a desecration of the spirit of Kuranda.

I refer, of course, to the gross and crass commercial premises of the BP Service Station, a visual insult which becomes even more glaringly evident at night, and the farce of the main street boat.

This particular monstrosity would be funny, if not for the fact that it is already, even in construction, a blight on the otherwise harmonious and mostly homogeneous main street.

I suppose it could be considered funny that someone (the strange person whose vision this represents) thinks that by building a big, ugly thing they will "create a focus" for the village and, in the process, "create their own history". Surely this is the height of arrogance.

Personally all I can see is a monstrous eyesore which has absolutely no aesthetic or other value.

It seems that this project is going ahead so I can see only two courses of action open to people who might hold the same view I do: firstly, don't patronise whatever service this monstrosity offers when (if) it is ever completed; and secondly, remember the names of the local council members who voted to approve its construction and, when they come up for reelection, dispatch them to the oblivion they deserve.

I would have thought that in 1997 we would have demanded more of a developer than a mere willingness to spend money, that there would be a requirement to demonstrate some sort of harmony on the part of an intended development, particularly in a village like Kuranda with its rainforest setting.

This "boat" coming after the BP service station, seems to be indicating that just about anything goes. So what next? The golden arches of the big Mac? Or the tasteful red and white of the Colonel's architecture? On present indications the answer to these questions is probably yes, and soon.

The application should state the purpose of the deputation, how it relates to the Minister's portfolio, indicate whether any previous discussion has occurred with a Government Agency/Minister, and include the names of those wishing to attend. Deputations will be limited to 15 minutes per meeting. Confirmation of appointments will be made on or prior to 24 November 1997.

A competition inviting local artists and designers to display their talents for the new Kuranda logo was held during October. KVPP Coordinator, Michelle Bell-Turner said "there has been a need to create a unique Kuranda signature and logo. The new logo will assist Kuranda in positioning itself by developing a unique image of the village which links to the cultural integrity of the region, the living culture, rainforest heritage, pioneering spirit and quality arts".

Details of the winning design will be published in next month's Kuranda Paper. The seeking of a new logo design is just one of the many strategies that the Kuranda Village Promotion Program, is implementing to ensure that Kuranda maintains its competitive advantage within the Tropical North Queensland product mix. Other strategies currently being implemented by the Marketing and Promotions working group include a village wide familiarisation program for businesses and staff, the development of a portfolio of promotional information, the development of a new visitor's guide and the continuing of quarterly visitor satisfaction surveys. Invitations and details of the Village Familiarisation Program will be distributed to businesses in the first week of November. Program Coordinator, Michelle Bell-Turner, said that a business development working group would be reactivated to concentrate on sponsorship, funding, customer service training and the development of tourism policy. In addition, a built environment working group will also be reactivated in November to focus on public arts and the development of a living gallery in Kuranda. These strategies are part of the 5 Year Promotion Plan for Kuranda Village launched on September 23. The plan is the result of 16 months work by volunteers of the KVPP to move towards ensuring the integrity of Kuranda Village both as a community and tourist destination.

Volunteers are required to assist in implementing the many great ideas outlined in the Kuranda Village Promotion Plan. ## THE KURANDA PAPER COMPUTER USER

**Report:** In flurry of announcements, Perth-based smart card maker Intellect has launched a personal terminal system that will allow card-based transactions over the Internet.

Intellect's MicroBank Personal Terminal is a handheld device that allows consumers to buy products, make bill payments and transfer money between bank account online. Users can also recharge the card from a bank account and transfer money between cards.

The terminal seeks to overcome one of the major concerns about ecommerce - the lack of security - with secure log-in software and anti-virus protection. Customer information can also be stored on the device.

MicroBank Personal Terminal - which also works via an ordinary phone line - works in conjunction with the Inte-com secure online banking platform, already supported by Advance Bank, the Commonwealth Bank and the Bank of South Australia. Intellect's billing the two as being the equivalent of withdrawing cash from an ATM, all from the comfort of home.

### TIPS OF THE MONTH For Win95

#### The Amazing Power of [Ctrl]A in Microsoft Word

Here's a keyboard shortcut you may not be aware of: [Ctrl]A. You press it when you want to select all of the text in the current Word document. Why on earth would you want to select all the text in the current document? Here are three good examples.

#### Changing fonts

First, suppose you've written a short letter and you decide you'd like to try a 12 point font instead of a 10 point font. To do so, just press [Ctrl]A to select all of the text, and then choose the new font size. Ba-da-boom -- your letter has a whole new look.

#### Changing attributes

Suppose you're working on a document that contains some bold text in various sections of the text. You want to get rid of the bold. Fortunately, you don't have to manually locate all the bold sections and "un-bold" them individually. Press [Ctrl]A to select the entire document. Next, press [Ctrl]B or click the Bold icon on the Toolbar. This step makes all the text in your document bold. Finally, press [Ctrl]B one more time to remove the bold formatting from the entire document.

#### Adjusting multiple fonts at once

Suppose you've designed a resume for yourself or for a close friend. Let's say you've used a 24 point font for the name, 18 points for the address, and 12 points for the body of the text.

Now, you decide there's just too much white space, and you want to make all the text just a little bit bigger. To do so, press [Ctrl]A to select all the text. Then, press the Grow Font key combination, which is [Ctrl] ] (that's [Ctrl] plus the right bracket). Each time you press this key, Word increases the size of all your text by one point. So, the 24 point text becomes 25 points, the 18 point text changes to 19, and so on. By the way, if you want to reduce the font size for some text, just select it, and press [Ctrl] [, (or [Ctrl] plus the left bracket).

#### Use [Ctrl]A with care

By the way, after you make formatting changes, be sure to deselect the text before you start typing. If you type any character with the entire document selected, you'll delete the old text. If that happens, just press [Ctrl]Z to undo the deletion.

Remember children are inquisitive, LOCK UP chemicals and poisons, put them out of reach. Never put fuel, bleaches etc. into soft drink bottles. Keep medicines out of reach. Always monitor children in baths and/or swimming pools. Remember a child drowns silently and there only needs to be in 1/2 inch (15mms) of water. You only need to turn away for a minute.

Remember to always put cold water in the bath first to avoid accidental scalding. Advise the young ones especially to wear helmets when riding bikes and horses. Don't carry babies or little children in your arms when travelling in a vehicle. Make sure you vehicle is in good condition and that everyone is restrained in the vehicle.

## CASSOWARY RECOVERY

The three regional groups: Daintree Cassowary Care Group, the C4 Group at Mission Beach and the Kuranda Environment Association, together with the Wet Tropics Management Authority, are proceeding with

- standardised record keeping of cassowary sightings,
- enquiries into the development of an urgently needed anaesthetic, to calm injured birds and enable treatment to proceed after an accident
- building special rescue boxes for carrying injured birds;
- domestic and feral dog control;
- enter into discussions with the Department of Main Roads re road design and the marking of the road where cassowaries habitually cross
- faecal analysis
- incentives for landholders to protect cassowary habitat
- revegetation of degraded corridors and establish of new ones.

A cassowary was sighted on Kennedy Highway on Saturday 27 September by our Waterwatch co-ordinator, Nicola Wright who quickly reported it to the Kuranda Environment Association by mobile phone. This valuable sighting is being followed up.

Rob Mortimer has extended an invitation for us to collect seeds from his property in Blackmountain Road to raise seedlings for planting out in our proposed alternative Wet Tropics Wildlife Corridor. ## THE WILDERNESS SOCIETY ON QUAID'S ROAD

Greg Sargent enlightened us on the implications for Kuranda if Quaid's road becomes a regular thoroughfare.

The 40,000 ha of Southedge, 2,000 ha is now under water in the form of a lake, is located between Julatten and Mareeba. Quaid envisaged that he would create a series of lakes and canals, and a resort type development to accommodate some 130,000 people. The land was purchased during 1984 and 1986 for \$250,000 and the road was built solely to provide access to Southedge from the coast.

Government approval was not sought to build the road, the road is not gazetted and Quaid has no lease of the road nor is it included in the FNQ2010 regional plan. It effectively forms an 18km barrier across the Wet Tropics forest and threatens the integrity of the biologically unique Blackmountain Corridor to the detriment of World Heritage values. In order for the government to consider gazettal of the road, a number of conditions would need to be met. The only condition met has been the sealing of the road. The Girgandydji aboriginal group is seeking land rights at the coastal end of the road which, if successful, will be significant in deferring use of the Quaid road.

Blackmountain Road bisects Quaid's road. The implication for Kuranda is that if the road is opened, Blackmountain Road, which traverses cassowary habitat and a region of globally important unique biodiversity, will be the next domino to fall... and a significant scientific and tourist asset will be severely threatened.

Is it important? Do we need biodiversity? Do we need another road?

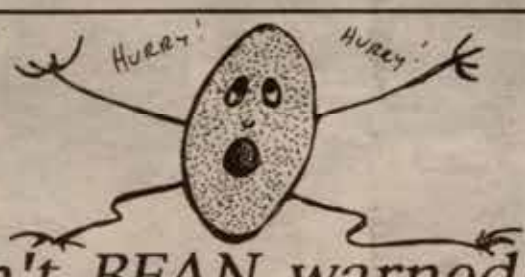

## GROWING GREENS IN CONTAINERS

by Jan Coulter

You don't need a lot of space to grow all the greens you need. I grow watercress, which is rich in vitamins and minerals in a cut down 25L container. It thrives on a bench under a tree. Kang Kong or water spinach is another one. It is a creeping tropical leaf vegetable which can be used in salads or stir fries. Celery grows well in a container.. I have a continual supply, just cutting off a stalk when I need it. Nasturtium leaves are handy for salads etc. and you can also eat the flowers as well as use them for decoration. Purslane contains more Omega-3 fatty acids than any other plant studied to date and also has vitamins A, C & E and is a high source of organic iron, so it has joined my collection. Seeds can be obtained from Eden Seeds. Chinese cabbage I have found out is richer in vitamins than ordinary cabbage. It has betacarotene, is high in vitamin C, very high in potassium and is a good source of calcium. My garden is a little different to most though as most salads, vegetables and herbs are grown using Hydroponic nutrient. Due to the faster growing times diseases and insects do not have the opportunity to take hold which means you can eliminate pest and fungicides in most cases. You know exactly what you and your family are eating. I have also found that the large variety of herbs I grow tends to keep the bugs away as well.

## PRACTICAL PROTECTION AGAINST INFECTIOUS DISEASE

From Kuranda Veterinary Surgery

All animals whether they be pets or farm livestock require to be vaccinated at regular intervals to maintain levels of protection against infectious diseases both for their own health and in a number of cases the health the people associated with them, that means YOU. The disease of most concern in this category is LEPTOSPIROSIS. It is usually spread by the urine of rats which then contaminates food and water supplies. Extended periods of wet weather aid the organisms to survive in the environment. The disease is also present in the feral pig population and can be transmitted to hunters or their dogs if they come in contact with the urine of an infected pig. In people, leptospirosis causes a persistent "flu-like" or chronic fatigue syndrome. For this reason hunters bringing young pigs home to raise are advised to vaccinate these animals for their and their families own health. The pig vaccine is available over the counter (so you can do it yourself). This same also applies to anyone with a small backyard piggery or a pet pig. In the dog Leptospirosis tends to cause both acute liver and kidney failure from which the animal usually dies (>90% of cases). Fortunately a vaccine is available to decrease the risk of disease and can be incorporated into the dog's yearly vaccination program. A number of cases of this disease have been diagnosed both at our surgery and other clinics in the area over recent months. Onto another canine disease of which there is an outbreak of in Cairns is PARVO. This disease doesn't affect people but is a big killer of unvaccinated dogs. The virus lasts over a year in the environment and needs only a small amount to cause disease. Usually dogs have bloody diarrhoea and uncontrollable vomiting, however, death can occur in less than 24 hours with no apparent signs. Summer is traditionally the time of greatest risk of outbreak of parvo so if your pets are not vaccinated or up to date then now is the time to do it. A number of vaccine are available for all species of domestic animals both to protect their health and in a number of cases, our own. If you have any queries about vaccinations feel free to give us a call or drop in for a chat.

## ORGANIC GARDENING

At long last some rain for my hard soil. Weeds and grass have been growing luxuriantly and their deep roots difficult to pull out. Mulch galore is the best way to keep soil round fruit trees and vegies protected from the baking sun plus your ornamental shrubs and flowers.-But what mulch? Beware some weed free mulches - they abound in grass seed. I have grown bananas for years and in dry weather find dry banana leaves wonderful ground cover plus the old trunks if you have a partner who can cut them with a cane knife. My veg garden is well mulched and cabbages are thriving still. Celery is not worth eating but I have left the plants so I can use the seeds for health drinks mixed with other herbs which are thriving eg. basil, parsley and mint. Sometimes I have to move plants because they need more or less sun or more or less shade. Growing in the tropics is no easy task. Mulch or shade cloth often helps and saves me the bother of moving a plant. I hate losing a plant through neglect. Garlic chives and chives are great hardy perennials which can be cut, chopped and eaten raw or, steamed etc. Leave the roots in the ground for only a short dormant period. I hate hanging baskets but I do have some lovely leafy bulbs that die down in the winter and shoot up again in the spring. Those pots need extensive dunking and some osmocote or fish emulsion or repotting into your own compost. My comfrey is thriving and makes lovely smelly liquid manure.

As usual heliconia and ginger roots are here free for those offering some help in return. Phone 937205.

## BUSH FIRE PRE-SEASON ACTION PLAN

Make a clean break around your home. Trim branches well clear of your house. Clear roof and gutters of leaves, twigs etc. Remove native shrubs growing too close to your house, as well as rubbish, vegetation, litter, and heavy mulch. Keep grass short and green if possible. Ensure garden hoses can reach points of possible fire spread. Store wood, fuel, paints etc. well clear of the house. Ensure smoke alarms are installed and operating. Develop and Practise an Exit Plan in case of fire. Dial 000 to report fire emergencies. The Queensland Fire and Rescue Authority is a community focused service. Phone 512005

Prior to coming to Kuranda Ms Jensen taught at many different High Schools, such as Clifton, Malanda, Smithfield, and St George High - sometimes as principal, sometimes as deputy principal.

Ms Jensen is looking forward to working at Kuranda High School. She has already met many of the Grade Seven Primary school students who will be attending the new High School finding them to be talented & well mannered!

When Ms Jensen visited the school site last week she personally viewed the different buildings which have been allocated for particular subject areas such as Manual Arts, Art, Drama and Performing Arts, Business Studies, Science, Home economics. She said there is also an amphitheatre and a large undercover area. The large undercover area designed for sporting activities will also be available for community use. It is situated right next to the oval and has a contoured, benched seating area where spectators can sit.

Rules and regulations will not differ much from those at Primary School but Ms Jensen will be involving students, parents and staff in discussion.

ARTIST PROFILE JOHN BEASLEY



'Celtic Myth' by John Beasley, was carved with chain saw from a Jacaranda log.

A professional sculptor for the past seven years, John works from the home he designed and built at Speewah. He creates intricate and delicate forms in wood using a chain saw for the bulk of the work. Even his tiny miniature pieces are shaped with a chain saw. He refuses to say how they are held as he works, except to remark that he still has all his toes. Largely self taught, John is influenced by the Japanese concepts of elegant simplicity and simple quietude, and is also inspired by the interwoven designs of Celtic art. His work has proven popular with both overseas and Australian art lovers, and is displayed that the Kuranda Arts Co-op, as well as interstate. Earlier this year John was chosen to create the marble sculpture which now stands in the park in Kuranda. He was delighted to have this opportunity to produce work that can be shared with the local community. Salvaged wood is the main medium used in John's sculpture, and he is often given timber that would otherwise go to the dump. He enjoys working in Jacaranda and African Tulip woods, amongst others, and is constantly researching new timbers and new tools. He uses power tools for the bulk of the work, but the fine finish that is so great to touch is only achieved with many hours of hand sanding. As well as sculpting, John does occasional furniture commissions on request, writes articles for woodworking magazines, and has written a book on power tool sculpting, for which he is still looking for a publisher. He has a great interest in and love for the environment, and is motivated to both create and preserve beauty in the world around him.

**A THOUGHT FOR NOVEMBER** By Fr. Chris Wright.

This month we open our Bibles and read from St. Marks Gospel verses 38 to 44. If you and I had to sum up in a word what Jesus wishes to see in a person's spirituality, that word could easily be reality or genuineness. In talks with a young wealthy man, Jesus was asked "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" and when asked by a scribe "which is the greatest commandment of all,?" Now in this passage we see it for a third time as Jesus reflects on the religious posturing that is going on around him. "Beware of long robes ..... salutations .... the best seats .... The places of honour...." Our Lord's attack is savage and accurate. Every word described a lifestyle that deftly mixes public adulation with private advantage, all in the guise of a righteousness that is essentially self righteous and self serving. The attack is also extremely dangerous to himself because many whom he is criticizing are within earshot and possess a great deal of power. Jesus' contempt for this sort of person is not based their piety. Most of these people are well meaning at heart - all of them were eminently respectable. Some certainly did works of compassion as the law demanded. It was not because they were pious that Jesus was angry. Piety in our age has sadly become a term of contempt but where piety is genuine in its religious observance, something flows from it - a life of service and compassion. This is what Jesus looked for in vain in the piety of his day. Today Jesus criteria is just as valid, if we wish to evaluate contemporary spirituality. In the Gospel passage, Mark takes us to the temple in Jerusalem in the forecourt people of every social standing give their gifts. In his usual vivid simplicity, Mark says "many rich people put in large sums". It is not a judgement just a statement of fact, but there comes into view a very different figure, a poor widow. Jesus watches her as she prepared to make her pitiable gift. He then calls his Disciples to observe the action. When they gather, he does what by now we expect him to do. He uses the incident to state a spiritual principal. The rich have given their gifts and so has this woman, but the fundamental question we ask of any gift is what it cost the giver. Whether the gift is small or large does not matter in the least. The issue is the relationship between the gift and the giver's capacity to give. Our Lord states "they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had".

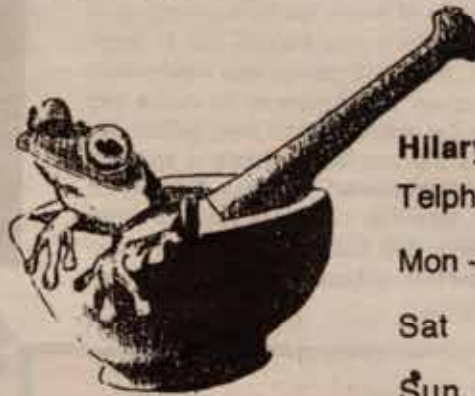

**KISC NEWS**

Recently, workshops to discuss youth suicide were held around the FAR NORTH. As well as raising awareness of the myths and attitudes, behaviour changes, and what to look for, in relation to this topical concern, participants were given the following important and useful information: \* Completed suicide is often preceded by a shameful or humiliating experience such as an arrest, perceived failure at school or work or rejection from a parent or romantic partner. \* With a measure of caring, understanding and thoughtful intervention **SUICIDE AS AN ACT IS PREVENTABLE.**

**WHEN SOMEONE IS THREATENING SUICIDE, WHAT TO DO?:**

- 1) Recognise warning signs. Take all threats seriously.
- 2) Get involved. Be available. Show interest. Express care openly.
- 3) Offer empathy, not sympathy. Try to see life from their point of view.
- 4) Ask about suicide. Be direct, don't be embarrassed. Talk openly about their suicide plans - get details. This will not give them the idea.
- 5) Be willing to listen. Accept their feelings. Offer hope. Do not reject the depth of their feelings.
- 6) Be non-judgemental. Do not lecture on the value of life, or how much they have going for them.
- 7) Don't 'dare' them, ridicule them or make them feel guilty to try and prevent suicide
- 8) Find their support systems - who can they turn to?
- 9) Talk to professional counsellors
- 10) Know who to refer them to.

If you feel agitated several breaths out through the nose should help to calm you.

**HEALTH ACROSS THE LIFE SPAN**

**DEPRESSION PART 3 (FINAL) Treatments available:**

**TALKING CURES:** Can be successful if there is a trust relationship between patient and therapist. Many people find it helpful to be assisted to look at their life, take charge of their thoughts and behaviour and take back control of their lives. A recent British study tested severely depressed patients with three different treatments - drugs, counselling or placebo drugs and general support. They found that assistance in problem solving was more effective than the placebo and as effective as the drug in treating major depression (Cairns Post 18/2/95). American research at U.C.L.A. found similar results (Journal of Abnormal Psychology Vol. 104, No. 4).

**CHEMICAL CURES:** Three out of four people feel better when taking medication such as Prozac, Faverin and Zoloft. While it is difficult to predict who will respond well to these drugs, in about 60 to 70% of cases the drugs help to relieve disabling symptoms, allowing for psychotherapy support to assist with learning more effective ways to cope. Chemical anti-depressants work by making serotonin available in the brain for longer, boosting their mood-enhancing effects. Despite many years of research and breakthroughs, the role of serotonin and other complex chemicals that make up the brain's neurotransmitters is only just beginning to be understood (TIME Sept 29, 1997). If prescribed anti-depressants, don't forget to ask your doctor or chemist about the risks of mixing with other substances.

**ELECTRICAL CURES:** Electro-convulsive therapy (ECT) may be used in cases of severe depression when other therapies have failed. ECT treatment has improved over the past decades; a general anaesthetic and muscle relaxant are given before a low electric current is passed through the brain to trigger a fit.

**NATURAL CURES:** Recent research has shown that St. John's Wort (Hypericum perforatum) is equal to standard anti-depressants in treating all but the most severe depression but has fewer side effects. However using this herb can cause photo-sensitivity (sunburn more easily). The amino acid Tryptophan (available at Health Food shops in the supplement ("Stress-eze") seems to be effective in treating depression but only in combination with other treatments. Exercise, something everyone can do in some form, not only prevents depression but has been shown to be an effective treatment for depression also. The herb Ginkgo has been shown to be more effective than a placebo in treating depression, among other things. (In France and Germany it is one of the most frequently prescribed drugs for circulatory problems). Massage has been shown to improve anxiety and depression - better than a relaxing videotape. (Alternative Medicine: What Works, Fugh-Berman MD). Other ways that you can help yourself include:

- \* Learn to like yourself by
  - (a) being honest with yourself and others
  - (b) stop procrastinating - set realistic goals and achieve them (however small)
  - (c) know who you are and what you believe
  - (d) realise you are as valuable as anyone else
  - (e) learn the art of positive thinking. Look for your successes rather than your failures
- \* Manage stress - while some stress can help us perform well, too much stress can contribute to depression.
  - (a) learn to problem solve - know what is in your control and what is not
  - (b) learn to say NO!
  - (c) Have a break - short ones during the day, or longer ones during a week. Make time for real fun and laughter, which are great tension relievers
  - (d) Relaxation - a forgotten art. Here is a basic, effective technique:
    - \* sit or lie comfortably in a quiet place
    - \* concentrate on your breathing, slowly
    - \* tighten every individual muscle, starting at your toes, moving up to the top of your head. Then relax each in turn, starting at the top of your head
    - \* continue to concentrate on your breathing, allow any distracting thoughts to flow out with each breath.
  - (e) Reward yourself - our society does not seem to encourage this, but take the time to give yourself a pat on the back and a present (eg - time to read a book) for a job well done whether paid or unpaid. Remember to reward or praise others for a job well done also - the more you do this the better you will feel. \*\*\*Look after yourself through exercise, a well balanced nutritious diet, and adequate sleep. (Depression: Lifting the Cloud, Dr. Christine Read).

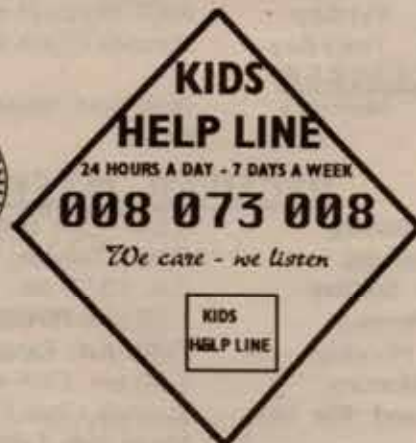

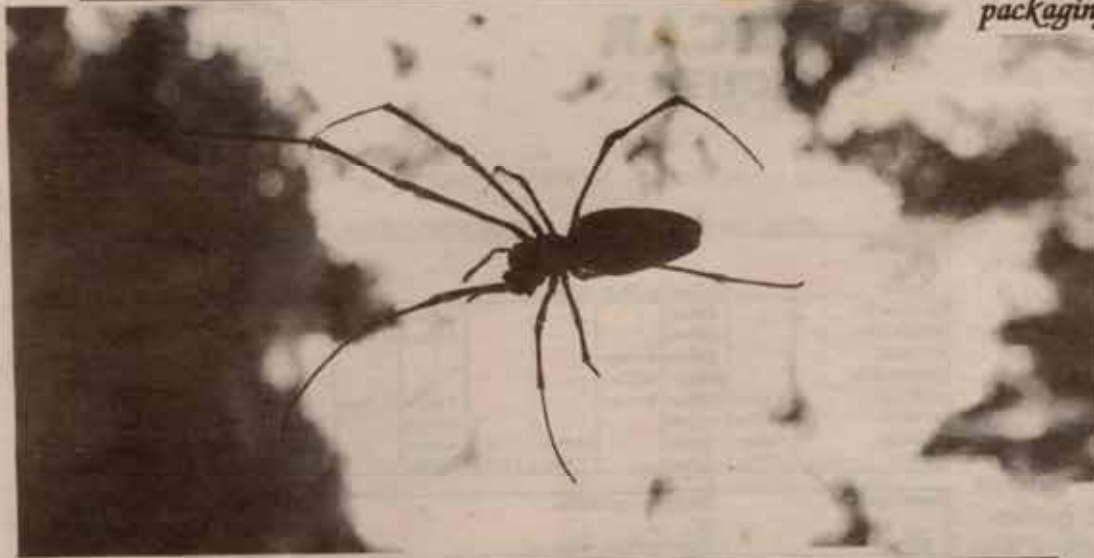
