Life at the Top of the Tree - A talk by JCU Associate Professor Andrew Krockenburger about climate change and our rainforest mammals.

SUMMARY: Folivory (leaf-eating) is an unusual lifestyle choice for a mammal and places a number of stresses and constraints on those animals that take it on. Foliage of trees is particularly poor as a diet because trees don't particularly want to be eaten either.

It has extremely high fibre (about 5 times as much as your morning bran) and low protein, as well as being packed with all sorts of toxic compounds, like cyanide that stop you using oxygen, tannins that erode away your gut-lining, fluorophloroglucinol compounds that stimulate the brain's vomit centre and alkaloids that give you hallucinations.

Folivorous mammals have developed a set of ways to deal with these problems- Professor Krockenberger will have a look at some of the problems and solutions developed by Australia's unique folivorous marsupials- How a koala squeezes enough nutrition out of gum leaves to support herself and a baby; Why possums are picky about the trees they feed in; and Why are our rainforest possums particularly susceptible to the effects of a changing climate. 



Luranda Jourist Train Services Pestored

Tourist train rail services between Cairns and Kuranda will resume on Tuesday, May 1 following a severe rock fall on the historic rail route from the Coast which enforced closure of daily services in February.

"The fact that regular rail services to Kuranda are to be resumed literally months before initial estimates is a testament to the enterprise and efforts of repair crews and engineers despite what must have been very trying conditions," Kuranda Village Promotions Program chairman Fr Chris Wright said. "Whether they are train buffs or not, the Cairns-Kuranda rail journey along this historic track remains one of the major train journeys of the world with thousands of tourists each year.

"Apart from the engineering marvel achieved in the late 19th century, the journey from the Coast affords visitors with picture perfect panoramas that are ever changing because of the mountainous nature of the journey. "This is why, when in regular service format, an average of well over 700 domestic

and international visitors take advantage of this unique experience each day of the year, with some of them becoming regular visitors.,"

A Thought for May

This month we read from the Gospel of St John Chapter 20 verse 1 to 18 paying special attention to verse 17. 'Jesus said to Mary Magdalene, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God. "" John 20:17

In 1994 a young British

In 1994 a young British actress went to Israel to make a video, in which she performed the part of Mary Magdalene telling her life story. The camera crew were all secular Jews, and on the first couple of days' filming they remarked what a good actress she was.

But on the final day's shooting, she told the story of meeting the risen Christ in the garden. At that point she stopped looking towards the camera and speaking to the viewers, and started speaking to Jesus and telling him how she'd tried to do what he'd told her to. The camera crew said afterwards, 'At that point she wasn't acting.

We couldn't see Jesus, but we knew he was there listening to her, because she really believed it herself.'

Many people watch Christians, to see whether our actions really show that we believe what we say and do in church, or whether we betray our insincerity. In fact Christians are all witnesses, whether they like it or not. Jesus told Mary Magdalene to 'Go and tell'. She had proved to herself that Jesus was alive. But this good news was too precious to keep to herself. She had to tell others.

By the conviction with which she spoke, they'd know that what she said was true. Women were not allowed to give evidence in the law courts of Jesus' day, because their testimony wasn't regarded as reliable.

But Jesus chose women to be the first witnesses of his resurrection, so that they could 'go and tell' what they knew from their own experience. What is your experience? Could you be a witness to the resurrection? Maybe you think not, because you've never seen Jesus.

But you've often spoken to him. Maybe it was only the unthinking recitation of a prayer like a formula. Maybe sometimes you were not very clear in your own mind whether there was anybody listening, or whether you were just speaking into a void.

But just occasionally you've felt that there really was somebody there on the other end of the line, listening to your prayers. And just occasionally they were answered.

You got what you were asking for. Or you didn't get it, but you received a spiritual strength which enabled you to cope with your disappointment and feel that all was for the best.

You couldn't have had any of those experiences, if the Jesus you prayed to had died 2000 years ago and never come to life

again. Your experience proves to your sceptical mind that Jesus rose again and is alive today, listening to your prayers. So, amazingly, you too are a witness to the resurrection, out of your own experience.

Many churches have a renewal of baptism promises on Easter as St Saviour's did. At our baptism we promised, or our godparents promised for us and we took the promises for ourselves at confirmation, to reject evil, repent of our sins and turn to Christ. Then we were baptized into the death of Jesus 'so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too, might walk in newness of life'.

Sometimes baptism and confirmation are spoken of as 'the ordination of the laity', when we're each given our ministry to perform in the Church. As well as achieving our own salvation, we all promise to serve others in the Church. Some are called to preach, others to give a word of warm welcome before the service and to lend a sympathetic ear afterwards.

And we're all being watched, to see whether we're sincere witnesses to the resurrection of Jesus, by our words or by our deeds. All Christians, without exception, are ordained to this ministry. Pray to God for the power that raised Jesus from the dead to be revealed in your life, in the love shown by your actions and the way you recount your own experience of answered prayer. Like Mary Magdalene, once we've received the gift of God's love, we have to 'go and tell'.



Forest Forums

- by the Fossils

Well unfortunately, Top Kowrowa missed out on its funding for the construction of new housing units and renovations to existing accommodation. An awful shame as many families there are living in overcrowded and poorly serviced conditions. Seems that despite protracted negotiations, community consultations and sound advice, the government offer was deemed unacceptable and everything fell over.

Public housing and affordable accommodation is becoming an important issue for the area. While home-owners are enjoying a boom in property values and rising rentals reflect this upward trend, the aged, lower income and indigenous families are finding it increasingly difficult to find appropriate and affordable housing in the area.

It is vital that Kuranda and surrounding areas are able to provide and increase stock of cheap, well-maintained decent public housing close to services and facilities. Without this taking place, there is a real danger that some groups become more marginalized and are forced to move from areas where they are established and have community links. Why should the aged, low income and indigenous families have to move out with consequent social disruption and additional burdens of costly transport to long distant facilities?

Presently, the Kuranda Neighbourhood Center is keen to gain some estimate of persons who would be interested in or would avail themselves of public or subsidized housing. Other agencies will also be collecting data on rental and public housing needs in the community and your registration will be strictly confidential.

Hopefully this data collection may lead to public address of growing affordable housing needs in an area slated for future major development. Presently there exists in Kuranda an excellent window of opportunity for creative use of the vacated Kuranda Primary School site. And yes, while an excellent site for some commercial developments, there is also the opportunity for land usage dedicated to affordable public housing with easy access to services and facilities.

On the same topic, a number of residents have, in the last few months, experienced incessant and irritatingly high noise levels from multiple occupancy rented premises. One can understand that, only by grouping together, can young people afford rental in the area. However the often absentee landlord has some responsibility in this matter. Generally, repeated noise complaints to Council and Police have resulted in short term cessation of noise only to be resumed after the authority's visit.

Kuranda as a town is more than a reverse Dracula - only coming alive during daylight hours with its injection of tourists. People live here - the well-off as well as the battlers. Unless we plan and cater for all members of our community, the richness and diversity of the community wanes and Kuranda becomes a mere simulacrum of a "more than a village in the rainforest".

"Having a number of keen intending competitors who cannot form full teams has been a very common problem that arises each year. So, if people would love to run in the race, but have trouble getting a full team together. Council will endeavour to assist these people and match them with others in the same situation," Great Wheelbarrow Race committee chairman and Mareeba Shire Deputy Mayor Evan McGrath said..

Garden Jottings by Alectura

Things to consider this month:

May 2007. With the rains on hold and coming cooler nights, the more tender plants in the garden are retiring for their winter rest. Mark caladiums, kaempheria and deciduous gingers so that underground storage organs are not damaged while digging. It is wise to have some knowledge of soil pH with many local soils having high acidity which tends to lock up fertilizer elements, also affecting soil conditions making it stiff and difficult to work with. Cheap soil testing kits are available with pH average 6 - 6.5 suiting most plants. Application of lime or dolomite (lime containing magnesium) raked in will reduce acidity. Think ahead to mulching for the coming dry and a general 'complete' fertilizer application for leached soils. With the drier weather, keep an eye open for red spider, usually given away by very fine webbing under-leaf with curcubits pumpkin, melon family particularly susceptible.

Plant of the Month: Selaginella (club moss, moss fern). A very large family with wide distribution

having over 700 species and much admired for their soft delicate foliage often with metallic sheens. The smaller trailing species such as S. krausseana and S. unicinata make excellent ground cover only asking regular moisture and cool sheltered conditions as do the more bushlet species such as S. involvens and S. martensii. Of the easiest propagation, almost any piece will root covered with moist sand. The more rampant S. wildenovii, syn S. mettalica (Peacock or Electric fern) will clamber to 3 metres and can prove extremely vigorous, although sometimes surprisingly difficult to propagate. Extremely beautiful with its shimmering metallic blue cast, this delicate looking plant may,

without care, prove invasive, Q. & A. Dear Bob, You asked for some information for planting up your garden with bird, butterfly and animal attractant plants. I would highly recommend a visit to our local Envirocare: and to Yuruga Native

Dear Liane, re your roses - mildew, with its white powdery patches under leaves and on stems can be prevented by spraying with Benlate or Mancozeb while blackspot where spots appear on leaves which then yellow and fall may be prevented with an organic or copper fungicide. And apologies - at long last a short list of some older and tried roses, possibly better suited to our conditions - (P) perfumed (V) vigorous Reds: Black Velvet (P), Chrysler Imperial (P & V), Ena Harkness (P & V) - prefers some shade. Papa Meilland (P & V), Roundelay (P & V), Tassin (P & V)l.: Pinks: Ann Letts (P & V), Blue Moon (P), Eiffel Tower (P & V), Prima Ballerina P & V), Queen Elizabeth (V). 

Potting with speed

Consensus by the regular nursery volunteers says the latest arrival is at least 50% faster. No, not a person, but a shiny new potting table, recently constructed



by Stewart Engineering. This latest addition at the Envirocare nursery was made possible by a Small Equipment Grant, successfully applied for by Jax last year. No more sore backs leaning over a wheelbarrow, the table is at bench height, can comfortably accommodate 6 people working around it, is very sociable and looks very professional indeed. We'll be getting our seedlings into grow out pots in comfort and with speed. Come on over to the nursery on

Monday or Thursday and check it out in operation.

Tree of the month - Yellow Wattle

Wattles are a significant part of the Kuranda landscape. They are often the first step in cleared land returning to forest. It can be very difficult to identify them by their leaves alone. Their flowers help to identify them but the best feature for identification is the seed pod. Many of the wattles are coming into flower this

Our plant of the month is Acacia flavescens. It can be identified by its cream coloured ball flowers with a diameter of about 6mm. It has a broad leaf with three prominent veins and 3 or 4 small notches along the leaf's upper edge. Acacia flavescens is a small tree or shrub and there are many of them in full flower this

Pick out a tree which fits this description and return in a few months to look at its seed pods. If you have the right tree, the pods will be flat, about 12cm long and

FNQ2025 plan

The Queensland Government is spending millions of dollars on a new regional plan for Far North Queensland, called the FNQ2025 Plan. This will replace the present FNQ2010 Plan, which was an advisory plan, with a legislated plan that can direct development and over-ride Councils. With the recent news of a major review of Councils, this should be the beginning of a new era in local government and planning in our area.

Although the Integrated Planning Act that guides development planning is this state is supposed to achieve sustainability, there has never been any serious effort to plan for a sustainable future in existing plans. Sustainability needs targets and limits, and requires monitoring of key indicators, and triggers for adjustment based on the outcomes of such monitoring. Environment groups in our area are working to try to achieve some real environmental outcomes in the new plan, with CAFNEC in Cairns acting as the coordinator. Kuranda Envirocare is involved in this, with John Beasley attending meetings. He will be reporting on progress throughout the year.

Electric Ants - already in a place near you

Electric Ants have arrived in Australia from South Americal You may have seen posters around Smithfield Shopping centre last year. Smithfield is the centre for the infestation, quarantine measures are in place and the aim of the current program is complete eradication. Ants have been spread to one of the Cairns beach suburbs via pot plants so it's very possible they may spread up the hill to Kuranda by similar means. They produce a very painful sting and affect horticultural crops.







Millipalas



Millipede literally means one thousand feet, this is a common misconception. The number of feet varies between species. Most species have over 30 pairs of legs, with some having up to 350 pairs! Millipedes have 2 legs per body segment.

Millipedes are timid, when threatened they will coil themselves into a tight ball. Some species are poisonous and if the poison is ingested can make you feel unwell, sometimes causing diarrhoea. The poison of some millipedes can contain cyanide or arsenic, animals.

Male Millipedes have specially designed mating legs on their 7th body segment, through which they transfer sperm to the female's genital opening. The female lays eggs in the soil, under logs or among eaf litter. The newly hatched young have 3 to 4 pairs of legs and additional body segments and legs are added as they moult.

Millipedes eat primarily detritus. They are distributed throughout the cool, moist environments of Australia. They are generally found under rocks, logs, among leaf litter, bark and soil.

In Kuranda we are fortunate to have our own specific species of Millipede, the Spirobolellus kurandanus. Discovered in the 1920's by Chamberline, little is known about this species. Far North Queensland is home of the Giant Millipede (Scaphitostreptus schellarum). An example of this species is on display at the Australian Venom Zoo. So come

Labor's Broadband Network to deliver

High Speed Broadband to Kuranda

A Rudd Labor Government would revolutionise Australia's internet infrastructure by investing up to \$4.7 billion, in partnership with the private sector, to establish the National Broadband Network.

Labor's candidate for Leichhardt Jim Turnour said, "The new National Broadband Network - to be rolled out over five years - will connect 98 per cent of Australians to high speed broadband internet services including residents of Kuranda."

"It will deliver internet services up to 40 times faster than most current speeds. This will increase speed to a minimum of 12 megabits per second."

"This means business, education, communication and household services on the internet - including entertainment - will happen in 'real time'," Jim Turnour said today.

Currently, Australia is 25th in the world in terms of available internet bandwidth.

"There are no medals for 25th - if we want to build long-term economic prosperity once the mining boom is over, now is the time to act!" Mr Turnour said.

The National Broadband Network will be funded by using existing government investments in communications to provide a public equity investment of up to \$4.7 billion in the new broadband network.

This would include drawing on the \$2 billion Communications Fund and the Future Fund's 17 per cent share in Telstra, which, consistent with the legislated position, will earn dividends and be sold down to a normal level over time after November 2008.

"We must remember the Howard Government privatised Telstra - 83 per cent has been sold.

EMERGING ARTIST IN KURANDA

The new name to watch in Kuranda art circles is Ramona T. Barstys.

Ramona has lived in Kuranda for many years and is involved in a number of community organisations. She was born in Canada to Lithuanian migrant parents. Although raised in Canada, Ramona retained her



heritage parents' and culture and she still speaks the language fluently.

Ramona arrived on our shores in 1977 and worked in hospitality for twenty years, qualifying as a commercial cook in 1989.

Blue Care community services then took up a lot of her time as Ramona worked in the aged care and disability areas. After her own health scare in 2004 Ramona decided to tread a new path; to do all the things she had been wanting to do all her life. Art topped that list.

Ramona set her objectives and started oil painting

with Claire Souter. One of her first completed paintings, bright sunflowers, was featured in the Kuranda Spring Fair exhibition in 2005. She enrolled at TAFE college in Cairns and this year she is completing her Visual Arts Diploma.

Ramona has recently been included in exhibitions at the Tanks, Foyer Gallery in Atherton and University of Southern Queensland, Toowoomba. She will be part of the June exhibition at Cominos House in Cairns and she plans to have her first (multi-media and wax encaustic) solo exhibition at the end of this year.

Easter has been and gone but it did not take the rain with it. Although many are resentful of the constant wet, this is the most wonderful growing period for bamboo.

For making simple things, bamboo cannot be bettered. In the tropics, it is found almost everywhere, in all sizes, and is immediately available for working with the basic tools - a knife and a saw. As a material it is almost universal, having qualities that are unsurpassed - strength, lightness, rigidity, and flexibility; it is also cheap and abundant.

Traditionally, bamboo constructions are held together with pegs or bindings of split bamboo rather than with nails or other metal fasteners, but the advent of synthetic adhesives has changed this. Now bamboo can be easily glued together; it can be laminated and worked like wood

The traditions of bamboo crafts have deep roots.

The crafts of bamboo are very pure. This is because bamboo itself as a raw material has almost no financial value and products and craft are derived entirely from the skill and art of the 'masters' hands. It is the craftsmanship itself which is prized as bamboo is not by its nature a material which can be expected to last a long time.

The Arts Co-operative makes good use of locally grown bamboo as poles for the colourful flags displayed

out side the gallery. However, due to the constant exposure they have to be replaced from time to time. A number of our artists use the offshoots for war sculptural pieces.

During term 1 we were able to engage in lots of natural science activities such as Worm farms & Frog Breeding!

Earlier when we were looking for the Dainty Green Tree Frog we couldn't find it despite looking at all the pebbles and plants in the box -it was in the food jar! The children were really surprised, "So that's what they eat... flies!" someone exclaimed.

When another child held the frog it jumped off his hand onto his face right next to his nose, "Isn't he cute," he said, everybody

When a child held one of the larger tadpoles it flipped over and as the children were looking at its intestines coiled under the skin they saw a tiny pink section above and it was beating. Wow!!




