



Dear Kuranda Paper Is anyone else becoming increasingly concerned with the amount of urban landclearing and planting of exotics that is occurring in our neighbourhood? Whilst 1/2 an acre here or there may not seem a lot, when viewed in context of diminishing habitat for our rare and unique rainforest fauna and flora, it represents additional pressures on an ecosystem that is already experiencing the pressures of urbanisation, introduced predators and invasive weeds, ie incrementalism or death by a thousand lashes. To see once contiguous forest patches that provide resources and faunal connectivity in an already fragmented landscape cleared and replaced with non-native gardens is very disturbing. Somehow we need to get the message across to new residents that if you don't like the rainforest, then don't buy a rainforest block. Council by-laws need to be introduced, as has been done in other shires, that require permits for tree felling. Permits can be issued for safety reasons, not to clear the way for English style garden beds and lawns resulting in creeping deforestation of our remnant forest patches.

Dear Kuranda Paper

There are two things you can do in the steps we need to take to regain a voice for Kuranda.

(1) Vote for me along with seven others. You must mark 8 boxes on the ballot paper. I am the only independent candidate standing for Mareeba Shire Council at this end of the shire. (2) Mark your choice on the official polling form called Options for Kuranda's Future. These forms will be available outside the election room at Kuranda Primary School on 27 March. They are also available from me personally (phone 4093 8834 or stop me in the street).

You can take part in the Options for Kuranda's Future poll even if you are not registered to vote in the election. This poll is open to all residents of Kuranda who are 18 years and over. All forms that go into the poll box must be initialled by an authorised person to ensure only one vote per person is registered. The poll closes at 6pm on 27 March 2004.

If cyclonic conditions prevent you from getting to a polling booth to vote, you should contact Mareeba Shire Council's Returning Officer, Colin McDowell, to ask for an adjournment of the poll for the Kuradna district. Colin McDowell has the power to call an adjornment of the poll for the whole shire or for any particular booth. Heavy weather may affect us more than the inland areas of the shire. As this election is important for Kuranda, we will be grossly disadvantaged if half our electors cannot get to a polling booth while those in the rest of the shire can. The most exciting news this month is the purchase by the State government (Dept. of Housing) of a house for use by the Kuranda Neighbourhood Centrel For those of you sharing our long and frustrating search for a suitable, secure and long term home, you would know that this heralds a new beginning for KNC after nearly 12 years of nomadic existence in a variety of "make-do" premises throughout

No.19 Thongon St. is the red brick house, across from the QCWA Hall on one corner and the Medical Centre on the other. It is an ideal building in a very central location. Negotiations are presently underway to secure the necessary modifications inside and out which will transform this lovely private home into an equally great Neighbourhood Centre. External work must include full disability access including paths, ramps and disability toilet as well as on site parking. Internally, some sort of cooling is needed (wouldn't it be unbelievable if we could actually get AIR CONDITIONING!!) An electrical upgrade and some safety and security issues also require attention. Acquiring the building is just the beginning: now the real work starts! But there's one sure thing: KNC couldn't have done it without YOU, our community members and your fantastic support.

(It remains to be clarified that the initially chosen block of land at No 5 Thongon St was ultimately deemed to be too steep on which to build a single level Neighbourhood Centre type building. This site, designated for ATSI housing,

will remain, with hopefully a new home constructed for an indigenous family in the

The advent of a new building coincides with the arrival of some new blood into the Centre. Vicki Donovan, a long time Kuranda local, has been appointed our "Thursday Worker" starting shortly. This means that after Easter, KNC will be open every weekday from 8.30am to 4.00pm. Each Monday morning at 9.15am we meet at the Kuranda QCWA Hall for our 50-60 minute program of gentle stretch and fitness exercises. Also included in the morning session is line dancing, tea/coffee refreshment and time for meditation. The cost is \$5p.p.

Last month we discussed preparing our body for exercise by massaging our feet with body oils. This month we open our Bibles to St Luke's Gospel Chapter 15 and read verses to 11 to 32.

It is really that this parable of Jesus became known as the parable of the prodigal son; its scope is far wider. It is so rich in insights about the way we human beings function and relate that in these few lines we cannot possibly exhaust its spiritual insight.

First, we see that there are two distinct chapters and three characters. The first chapter is about the younger son, the second about the older. Each chapter describes the relationship of each son to his father and, in a lesser sense, to one another.

Very quickly Jesus draws an unflattering portrait of the younger son. He is self-centred, uncaring, ungrateful, and he experiences the consequences of his choices. But then there come the great words "when he came to himself." This is the point of turning and returning. He comes home and is received by his welcoming father with great joy. Seeing the welcome, the older son is incapable of understanding the dynamic of what is happening, because the experience is an unknown for him. He, the very person who has by his own claim always retained the relationship with his father, now spurns it. The younger son who had spurned it, now knows its value and claims it. The older son has never felt the need of forgiveness and so cannot understand what it means to be forgiven. Tragically and paradoxically, by his never leaving home he cannot know the joy of returning, by his never having stepped away from a relationship he cannot step back towards it and be received, by his never becoming a person in his own right he cannot understand



The highway would clear more than 27 hectares of rainforest, some in the Wet Tropics World Heritage area, and countless animals lose their habitat. A hundred of these will be plant and animal species of known conservation

The Wet Tropics Management Plan requires that rezoning can only occur if no prudent and feasible alternatives are available. Less destructive alternatives do exist, eg increased overtaking lanes, improved road surfaces, minimal realignment, improved public transport and rail freight options.

Further Consequences

Two major developments are planned in the Kuranda area: settlements of 5000 to 8000 in the Myola valley and in excess of 30 000 at Koah.

Surely this area is a most inappropriate location for urban expansion.

This brilliant calligraphy was done for the volunteers, in the field, by students from Japan who came to help plant trees on Simone and Roy Gorry's property in Myola. On Saturday 6 March, 200 high school students, teachers and guides arrived in 5 buses at the corner of Myola and Barnwell Roads. The day was clear and dry but a little hot for our visitors who were not used to the tropics. But, out in the paddock, with the cows, geese and turkeys looking on, the students put on a show for us that we'll never forget. We were presented with exquisite embroided plaques, singing in both Japanese and English, and scrolls and boards with Japanese characters painted for us on the spot.

Following this display of fine artwork and cultural expression, we then marched through the paddock, side-stepping the cow pats, loaded with 1000 rainforest seedlings to plant. The volunteers instructed the students how to plant the trees and pack the mulching hay around them before watering them in with the Myola Rural Fire Brigade truck.

Out there in the wide open spaces, with the farm animals nearby and the metallic starlings squawking overhead in the Cadagi tree, it must have been an awesome experience for those 15-17 year olds who live in such a different environment.

There was one incident when one young girl shrieked with fright, jumped several metres and sent her load of trees flying. We rushed to her aid and she pointed to the tiniest frog, as small as your little finger nail, which was bouncing off in the opposite direction as fast as it could go. We realised that what we take for granted is a whole new world for most other people.

Effective Self Defence Training

It is often questioned by the uninformed how Queensland Self-Defence can be an effective method of self defence when the training activities are non-contact. In response to this statement, the following aspect of our curriculum should be considered.
