WARREN ENTSCH MP

Federal Member for Leichhardt Warren Entsch Welcomes Increase in Local News Content.

Member for Leichhardt Warren Entsch today welcomed the Australian Broadcasting Authority's introduction of new compulsory licence conditions that will force regional television stations to broadcast local news and current affairs. The ABA has made it a condition of commercial licence holders in aggregate regional markets, including Cairns, to broadcast matters of local significance, using a points system to measure whether broadcasters are meeting their targets. "This is a great win for communities in Far North Queensland that have experienced a shortage of local news content since Southern Cross Broadcasting abandoned its local news service last year," Mr Entsch said.


"I would like to congratulate WIN Television who, through this inquiry process, has maintained the integrity of local news services in the region. WIN's ongoing commitment to Cairns means the ABA's new condition will have no impact on the station at all.

"I would also like to acknowledge the contributions of some of the ex-Ten news team who really drove the issue of fair and adequate news coverage, playing a significant role, in my view, in achieving this positive outcome. "In particular, cameraman David Thompson and journalists Danae Jones and Jamie Rule should be singled out and commended."

Mr Entsch said having access to local news and information is critical for people in communities across Far North Queensland, where news from the capital may not be relevant, and the new ABA requirement for regional stations to broadcast up to two hours of local news and information a week is good start.

"While it is a positive step in the right direction, I will be monitoring both the news content and the public's response and, if the level of local content is still found to be lacking, I will be pushing for the ABA to increase that level further," he said. Mr Entsch said he will also be monitoring the region's radio stations to ensure they also broadcast an adequate level of local news content.

The new licence condition is due to come into effect on July 6. If broadcasters fail to meet their local content obligations, they will be in breach of licence conditions and the ABA will be able to pursue infringement action, which could include monetary fines and, in extreme cases, a withdrawal of licence.



Local Artists creating main street art

In late 2002 the FNQ region's creative industry association, Arts Nexus, was awarded the contract by Mareeba Shire Council to manage the Public Art component of the beautification works in lower Coondoo street. in conjunction with SitePlan as the landscape architects. The brief for this second half of the Kuranda main street from the Fitz's Pub corner to the Railway/Skyrail was informed by earlier consultation surveys by Council. The main findings included such considerations as the retention of parking spaces, the continuation of the 'tunnel effect' on the big figs trees in the landscaping, and an increased focus for visitors to be attracted to cross from the busy side of the street to the quieter side.

The appointed Arts Nexus Public Art Manager is Margy Timmermans, whose previous project included works by many artists in the half kilometre River of Life pathway in Cooktown between the arrival wharf and the town centre, a major project due for completion in May 2003. Rather than undertaking solo artist commissions, Margy works with an inclusive cultural exchange process that encourages the artists to collaborate in the place-making ideas and symbols for each space as an expression of the Kuranda community, as well as supporting each other as fabricators for the installation phase. For Kuranda, an artists brief was prepared and distributed at a focus meeting where artists who had forwarded expressions of interest met one another to discuss the way forward. The brief nominated 4 major nodes as sites for artworks as well calling for artworks as linkages, such as seating treatments and pavement tiles throughout.

The Major Nodes Crossroads, the node at Fitz's pub major corner, called for a splash of colour to signify good times, music and entertainment and the diversity of people who have crossed paths in that spot over the ages, from honeymooners to hippies, from timber-getters to tourists. Hunting and Gathering, the Jilli Binna site, called for a major statement made by the original Dgabugay of their relationship with this place. Sharing of Resources was the title of the node outside the Wangal area, and called for a collaborative artwork between original Dgabugay and other Indigenous residents of Kuranda and supported by non-indigenous artist fabricators. Gateway Node [the welcome to Kuranda around the Railways, Skyrail and the Fanny O'Reilly's [Bottom Pub]. The signifiers on both sides of the road and the crossing will bring to the fore our transport links, especially the 100 year relationship between Kuranda and Queensland Rail, with a railway walk, as well as heritage and other pioneer industries such as timber and farming, as a who-we-are walkway of discovery.

Concepts from 13 artistes, 12 of whom are Kuranda residents including five Aboriginal artists, have been passed firstly by the Public Art Reference group, and were then presented to the Kuranda Advisory Committee on 20 January. With the whole streetscape beautification about to start, these will next be presented by Arts Nexus to the Mareeba Shire Council on 4 February 2003 for final approval. Hi there members and friends,

As this is the final newsletter of this years committee, I'd like to be able to fill it with great news for the Amp ... alas the red tape keeps wrapping around us. For every tape cut there seems to be another ten waiting!

In the last newsletter we advised you of a meeting with a council representative regarding the lease and public liability. We have recently received correspondence stating..."It appears that it is not as simplistic as we originally thought, in regard to council being responsible for claims against assets and your Society having responsibility in relation to activities. The advice we have received states that the need for you to provide liability goes further than this and requires ALL claims, actions, suits, costs and expenses for any claims which may occur at the Amphitheatre. As per our original discussion with you and Trish Buckley, I see no alternative to this situation based on the fact that the current lease agreement is binding for all parties..." Quoted from correspondence dated 13th December, 2002 from L.Rojahn for NP Briggs (CEO - Mareeba Shire Council).

On Council advise, we didn't renew volunteer insurance, as these volunteers are maintaining a Council asset. So, we feel we have come full circle with only a few small gains (rates lowered etc).

We have since heard from Qld Govt Insurance Taskforce that Suncorp have withdrawn as the underwriter for that particular scheme. We are currently renegotiating this application, and investigating other avenues which have recently become available to us. A Draft Development Plan has been sent to Michael Lawrence (Qld Regional Business Advisor) who will then return it to us with comment, adjustments etc. We would like to present the Development Plan at the Annual General Meeting. A lot of time and energy has gone into the Development Plan as Council insists we submit a "Business Plan" to be eligible for RADF and ASTRAC grants.

We have been continually rejected on grant applications because of venue closure etc, but thanks to Diana Monaghan we are consistently re-applying. On this point, we'd like to thank Diana for the amount of fundraising she has co-ordinated this year, we've been able to pay the bills! Congratulations to Salvadore who won the New years Eve raffle and once again thanks to the Kuranda Village Coffee Shop for their support and kind donations. The next raffle is a painting by John Lockyer, so look out for Diana who will immediately sell you a ticket. Thanks again John. On the money... the guerney (high-pressured cleaner) was taken from the shed in November and has not yet been returned. This guerney was not only useful in the Amp grounds, but was also hired out to members of the public and had became a regular source of income. Bookings have since been cancelled and therefore another financial loss to the Amp.

Obviously, whoever 'borrowed' the guerney has a key and it would be greatly appreciated if you would please return it.

On a more pleasant note, we'd like to welcome the newly formed STARKARTS (Kuranda Youth Performing Arts) under the auspices of the Amp. these guys are our next generation of performers and Amp carers, so please give them your support. A working Bee is scheduled for Saturday 15th Feb, if you are able to attend please give Vaughan a call on 4093 8084.

Once again, there's an AGM SATURDAY 22nd FEBRUARY, 2003 4.30PM

We intend to celebrate afterwards and naturally would like everyone to join us. So bring your own plate of nibbles, grog and insurance!

We'd like to stress the importance of committee nominations, every year the same thing is said, but perhaps the Amps' situation has never been so dire. For the Society to remain, negotiations which are underway need to continue and this committee is very tired. As we've seen in the last year, the Society can still function with a closed venue - not very exciting for gig-goers - but at least it's all still there. There aren't many options left for the amp ... we either close it down, or find a committee who is prepared to keep up the fight and get the amp open. This will all be discussed at the AGM so it is vital our 110 members come to what may well be the Amps last AGM (seriously). Hope to see you all there. 

A Thought for February

The Story of the wise men is a very important part of the Christmas story and in Churches all over the world there arrival is celebrated on the 6th January or on the Sunday eagerest to that date

St Matthew records in his Gospel that 'When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy.' Matthew 2:10

Journey's end, with mission accomplished, was surely ample cause for joy. These mysterious Magi had travelled from the Orient with one eye on the road and the other on the star. They had met a ruler suffering from paranoia (v. 3)) in Jerusalem, who seemed to know of a King but not of his whereabouts - but the star had led them to the object of the enterprise, so their joy could have full rein.

What have these Magi (Wise Men) to say to us today? They brought costly gifts. How much does our love for Jesus mean? They brought meaningful gifts, tailored to the recipient. Do we bring Jesus our finest talents, our prime time - or just what is left at the end of the day? They came a long way. How far do we go, or are we prepared to go, in the service of our Lord? They asked for nothing in return, save the privilege of kneeling in adoration before the Child. Are we always asking Jesus for things? Are there times when we simply take delight in being in his presence?

Oh, don't these Magi challenge us, in ways we may not feel like coping with, so soon after the frenetic season of Christmas! It was enough - amply sufficient - for the Magi to worship the Child, and then return to their homeland. That they were securely in the will of God is seen by their obedience to God's message as they slept,

Do we take notice of the stuff that dreams are made of? We should. God's messages today come in many ways, and dreams still fall short of a purely medical, clinical diagnosis. Some churches are cold, some are hot, others nicely heated; some have AC, some are large, others small; some are 'high', while others are 'low'; yet none of these criteria really matter.

The crucial factor is: does the church (i.e. the Christians in it) welcome newcomers, grow in fervour, love each other and take great joy in witnessing for Christ? It has been said that today's Christians are sadly lacking in the ability to be joyful. Who, then, will ever be encouraged to come to Christ through us?

Who have we encouraged to come to worship in the last year - or have we kept the joy of the Lord to ourselves? In some countries there is still an official ban on Christian evangelizing; would there be a greater willingness to defy that law, were such a thing operative in the Australia of 2003?

As we reflect on the time and effort expended by the Magi in their determination to seek and find Jesus, inevitably the contrast between them and the Jews is pointed up: while 'his own people' largely ignored him, or (as in the case of Herod) actively opposed him, Jesus attracted Wise Men from a distant land.

He was later to warn the Jews: 'Many will come from east and west and will eat with Abraham and Isaac and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven, while the heirs of the kingdom will be thrown into the outer darkness' (Matthew 8:11, 12).

How is God talking to us? Are we listening? Are we contemplating? Are we ready enthused? Or are our minds closed our hearts cold our backs turned. Or are we awake, Ready, Loving, Accepting.

Hydroponics

I have had tomatoes all through the Xmas- New Year period. I have replanted and hope that the wet season will not drown them. It is easier with Hydroponics though, you just leave the taps open and the water flushes through. When the rain stops you feed them again. I am growing Warragil greens for the chooks, they love them, and they seem to grow all year round. I purchased some pak choi (oriental) seeds in Kuranda. They are easy to grow and are lovely in stir fries etc. Quite a number could be grown in a broccoli box with a drainage hole about 5cm from the bottom. They are the small variety and you only need a couple for a meal. The lettuce are doing well.

I have just planted a new batch. I raise the seeds in river gravel and plant them out when they are about an inch high. They are very sturdy. I call them my little soldiers. All my herbs are doing well. I worked with an executive once who insisted that everybody use fresh herbs. Great boxes of them used to get delivered every week so I learned to use all sorts of herbs. My Paw Paw tree in the drum turned out to be a male. Does anybody know how to sex Paw Paw plants when they are small.

I have regular massage and accupuncture all of which help keep the aches and pains to a minimum. The fresh organic food from the garden keeps me going.





INTEGRATED PLANNING ACT AND NEW SHIRE PLAN

Deadline for completion of the new Shire Planning Scheme conforming to the requirements of the IPA, has been postponed till July 2004. However, Mareeba Shire Council may finish its plan at any time before that date and submit it to the public for comment. No doubt the public consultation phase will be well publicised but KURANDA *EnviroCare* will keep you informed about any community workshops that are planned.

THE KURANDA ENVIROLINK WILDLIFE CORRIDOR PROJECT

This project has now been officially completed. That is to say, the money has been spent and 30,000 trees planted. In reality, we are still planting, weeding and watering, and recovering from flood and fire. There are more than 60 properties in the corridor as well as Council managed State

The rehabilitation of many hectares of degraded areas in the corridor is more than enough to crow about, but there's another immeasurable outcome that can't be seen as clearly as the fresh green foliage of an emerging forest. That is the development of a community network of people with common environmental goals and values. Kuranda didn't have this five years ago, now it does.

A comprehensive final report will shortly be written about this project. It will also be available on our website.

SO ON WITH OUR NEXT RIVERCARE PROJECT

We are already underway with an extension of the EnviroLink Corridor project which involves unchoking the mouth of Queens Creek (next one down from Dismal Creek) and replacing the weeds with more suitable native trees and grasses. The idea is to allow the creek to flow more freely so that it can flush itself clean as it should.

AND OUR COMPENDIUM OF INFORMATION FOR NEWCOMERS

This project will see the production of an information pack for residents and newcomers to the area about what to plant, what not to plant, rules and regulations about keeping domestic pets and where to go to get other information you need when you're new to town.

THE BARRON WATER RESOURCE PLAN

All in all, the Barron Water Resource Plan makes a real attempt to address sustainability. Naturally that means that protection of the environment is basic to the plan. It doesn't advocate more dams, more irrigation and expansion of farmland but it does insist on greater efficiency. This falls to all of us, with towns people being able to contribute in no small way by just easing up on wastage.

WORKING BEES

We love our Saturday morning tree planting so much, we just can't stop doing it. We still have heaps to do in the Envirolink Wildlife Corridor and along the Barron River. So, except for Saturday 8th Feb, you'll find the EnviroCare signs along Myola-Oakforest Road from 8am for an hour

On Saturday 8th February, we'll be joining the Boonooloo group at 8am at the corner of Stoney Creek Road and Kelly Road. Someone in that group makes one hell of a chocolate cake!

Book Review

Janice Starck's review of Dingo innocent We may ask ourselves if we need another book about the Azaria

Chamberlain/Dingo tragedy. Buck Richardson's new book, Dingo innocent, most assuredly proves we do.

Buck has painstakingly re-read all the transcripts from the case and has come away with a profound sense that justice was, at best, an optional extra, if all else failed.

Lindy Chamberlain was subsequently acquitted after several years in jail when a matinee jacket worn by Azaria at the time of her death was discovered in the desert. It was a fortunate twist of fate for Lindy, which gained her release.

Buck's research and subsequent new look at the case is in fact chillingly riveting. He is armed with no more than the facts, many of these were not presented to the trial jury. You now have be setting up camp outside the Post Office each Thursday all the facts.

Buck's writing is clear, concise and scholarly. It flows with a logical current and reads like a thriller. Throw out your beliefs and prejudices and start again. We were never presented with all the data and in all fairness our various conclusions mirrored this.

KURANDA CRAFTS IN SYDNEY MARKET PUSH

In mid February the Craft Connect project (located at the Kuranda Arts Cooperative and in partnership with FNQ's creative industries association Arts Nexus) is travelling to the Sydney gift fair at Darling Harbour taking the work of 9 local craft and design artists.

This includes our own Kuranda artist: Ceramics - Mollie Bosworth. Glass artist -Terry Eager, Ceramics and glass, Jana Iriyadi. Timber and graphic arts, Cantata Studio, Toni Rogers. Silks Silkworks Studio Kathryn Edwards.

The Sydney gift marketing and trade event reaches 30,000 retail buyers nationally and will project our local artists into new market places across Australia.

The FNQ Craft Connect showcase is a joint presentation also linked to the FNQ Indigenous Arts Marketing Project (FNQ-AMP) that has recently developed over 50 precious metal designs as a new line of handmade authentic Indigenous jewellery from the Far North, assisted by local foundry Labyrinth Design.

Craft Connect is the most recent stage in a 2 year push to create a local craft and design industry from scratch. Services are provided to craft artists and designers from remote and regional areas of FNQ. The first ever Craft Connect expo event at the Cairns Hilton in 2002 led to an invitation by Tourism Queensland to Singapore as part of the promotional launch of the new Australian Airlines last year. The latest news is that Craft Connect has been invited back to Singapore in March to represent Queensland to showcase the best of Australian arts and culture, this time for the national body - Australian Tourism Commission (ATC).


Anne's message is to make people aware of the endless sacrifice/suffering animals must make daily for humans.
