

areeba Shire Council's new Planning Scheme is open for scrutiny and public comment. The role of the Planning Scheme is to establish guidelines for ecologically sustainable development within the shire.

Following a public meeting in Kuranda in September at which the scheme was discussed,

Kuranda Envirocare has been coordinating a working group which will make a detailed submission to Mareeba Shire Council. Kuranda Envirocare is urging Kuranda residents to act now to ensure that our natural environment is adequately protected. Individual submissions are very important in alerting Council to any weaknesses in the current plan.

The new plan offers significant protection to vegetation in only about 20 square kilometres of the Shire's 53,000 square kilometres. Areas identified by Kuranda residents in the past as peeding protection, and included in

residents in the past as needing protection, and included in the 1998 Development Control Plan for the Kuranda area, have not received protection in the new planning scheme.



Kuranda residents spent thousands of hours in fortnightly meetings between May 1994 and August 1995, to produce a community planning document that was presented to Mareeba Shire Council. After consultants reshaped it in 1997, it was adopted by Council as a Development Control Plan in 1998.

The Kuranda community has already shown its commitment to protecting our environment. Tree planting by Landcare, and later by Kuranda Envirocare, has seen about 80,000 trees planted by hundreds of volunteers in the Kuranda area. Kuranda Envirocare promotes the Envirolink corridor which aims to restore cassowary habitat and reinforce a natural corridor to the west of Kuranda. It also runs the Envirocare nursery, which currently stocks about 10,000 locally produced seedlings, and is helping to establish a

plantation of local native timbers at Kuranda High school. The Natural Heritage Trust has invested around \$200,000 in tree planting in the Envirolink Wildlife Corridor.

Envirocare President John Beasley has been alerting the community to shortcomings identified in the plan. "It is essential that the planning scheme protects areas that are being rehabilitated by the community" he said. "In their current form the development constraints in the Planning Scheme are not adequate to fulfill this obligation. For example, only part of the Envirolink corridor receives any protection. While Council intended to undertake

an essential environmental audit of the shire as part of writing the plan, this has not been done."

"In its current state, the new Planning Scheme will give

the public no opportunity to comment on most development. Instead there will be codes which will guide development decisions. Kuranda Envirocare does not believe that the proposed codes will adequately protect the environment.

Increased environmental protection and greater public involvement in the decision making process are necessary now, if we are to see the proper protection of the unique natural assets of this area we call home."

Community comment on the plan will be accepted by Council until the 26th of November.

#### What You Can Do.

- Read the Planning Scheme. It is in the Kuranda Library or it can be purchased from the council in hardcopy or computerized form. Kuranda Envirocare also has a copy.
- Make a submission. The instructions for making a submission are outlined in the back of the scheme, and individual submissions are important. For further information see the Envirocare website at <u>www.envirocare.org.au</u> or phone Jax at 4093 8834 or John at 4093 0303.
- In particular, request that the environmental safeguards in the 1998 DCP are maintained in this new scheme.

# We Will Miss Him

Today we mourn the passing of an old friend by the name of Common Sense.

Common Sense lived a long life but died recently in the United States. No one really knows how old he was, since his birth records were long ago lost in bureaucratic red tape.

He selflessly devoted his life to service in schools, hospitals, homes, factories and helping folks get jobs done without fanfare and foolishness. For decades, petty rules, silly laws, and frivolous lawsuits held no power over Common Sense.

He was credited with cultivating such valued lessons as to know when to come in out of the rain, why the early bird gets the worm, and that life isn't always fair.

Common Sense lived by simple, sound financial policies (don't spend more than you earn), reliable parenting strategies (the adults are in charge, not the kids), and it's okay to come in second.

A veteran of the Industrial Revolution, the Great Depression, and the Technological Revolution, Common Sense survived cultural and educational trends including body piercing, whole language, and "new math."

His health declined when he became infected with the "Ifit-only-helps-one-person-it's-worth-it" virus. In recent decades his waning strength proved no match for the ravages of well intentioned but overbearing regulations.

He watched in pain as good people became ruled by self-seeking lawyers.

His health rapidly deteriorated when schools endlessly implemented zero-tolerance policies. Reports of a six-year-old boy charged with sexual harassment for kissing a classmate, a teen suspended for taking a swig of mouthwash after lunch, and a teacher fired for reprimanding an unruly student only worsened his condition. It declined even further when schools had to get parental consent to administer aspirin to a student but could not inform the parent when a female student was pregnant or wanted an abortion.

As the end neared, Common Sense drifted in and out of logic but was kept informed of developments regarding questionable regulations such as those for low flow toilets, rocking chairs, and stepladders.

Common Sense was preceded in death by: his parents, Truth and Trust; his wife, Discretion; his daughter, Responsibility; and his son, Reason.

Not many attended his funeral because so few realized he was gone.





# **A Thought For November**

This month we open our Bible at the Gospel of Mark and read Chapter 10 verses 35-45.

What's in it for me? It's a common phrase these days, and even if we don't actually say it, we very often think it. None of us can climb out of our human skin. "Greed is good" says a character in a movie of the late eighties about the world of stock and bond markets. This passage in this months reading has that kind of phrase hovering in the background.

The disciples have been together with our Jesus for over two years. Things seem to be getting to a point of decision. They are on their way south from Galilee to Jerusalem.

Though they don't yet know it, this will be their masters last journey to Jerusalem. Jesus is trying once again to get them to realise what may be ahead of him. Perhaps fearing that they may not have another chance, two of the disciples decide to make a bid for special treatment.

"Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." There is an unattractive childishness about their approach. They want guarantees before they even ask. Jesus, knowing them by now, is very wary. He demands they become specific. He probably senses the worst, and he is correct.

Their request is a sleazy and self seeking concern about getting ahead of the others. They want special privileges. They think a grand kingdom is coming, and they want some payoff. Our Lord is disgusted, angry, and frustrated. We can here this in every word of his response. He begins by sarcasm. He shows that they do not have the remotest idea of what they are asking.

They have not heard a word about the terrible cost of the immediate future. Their only agenda is self advancement and greed. Nothing stays private in a small group. Our Lord points out that in human society authority is based on power and position. In his followers Jesus demands another basis for authority. Among Christians authority is based not on position and power, but on servant hood. It is perhaps the hardest lesson for us to learn. To the degree that we learn it, we become like Jesus. Jesus tells us that authority is not based on power and position but on servant hood. Having told us this, he himself lives it.

# AMAZING TEAM WORK

It's amazing what can be achieved with a little help from your friends. In our case, we are achieving awesome tasks with the help of a Green Corps team, a Conservation Volunteers team, a Green Reserve team, a team of Workers for Dole and just plain, ordinary, wonderful volunteers.

The Green Corps team comprises 10 young people between the ages of 17 and 20. They are with us for six months learning all about fire control and containment in Kuranda's rainforest environment. They'll be talking to local residents about strategies to reduce fire hazards while putting in weeks of hard brushcutting (to clear guinea grass) before planting tree species that belong to the area. As an extra project, you should see the community vege garden they've created.

Pam, Jax and all our other volunteers have been giving instruction on nursery procedures, Bruce Wannan has shown them how to set up photo points using a GPS in the field, and Andrew Horn has taken them through the forest for a plant ID lesson. This was topped by a walk along Douglas Track, Speewah, with Clem Riley and Kim Assan to get first-hand knowledge of how Indigenous people used trees for making tools (how do they get the bend in boomerangs?!) and which fruit are edible. We even stumbled upon a couple of Cassowary scats (poo) full of seeds. We were able to glean all sorts of information from those interesting deposits.

There can be up to 30 people occupied in any number of projects at the EnviroCare nursery these days such as seed collecting, potting up, delivering mulching hay, welding trailers, building, concreting — and enjoying bottomless cups of tea.

#### MAREEBA SHIRE'S NEW PLANNING SCHEME

This is the most important topic at the moment because we only have till 26th November to let Council know what changes we think need to be made to the Scheme to take us through the next 7 years.

The main points are:

The Kuranda EnviroLink Wildlife Corridor around Kuranda (from Kowrowa via Myola to Speewah) has not been identified and so can't be protected;

The word "Cassowary" does not even appear in the lengthy document which indicates its habitat is not protected;

The promised environmental audit, which was to form the basis for protection of the environment, has not been done. This means that areas of value have not been identified and therefore are not protected by the plan.

If you write to Council asking for these shortfalls to be addressed in the draft Plan, you will be making a meaningful contribution towards protecting Kuranda's special environment.

#### KURANDA RANGE ROAD UPGRADE-WHERE WE STAND

Many of our members do not believe a massive road upgrade is necessary. Others believe that whatever upgrade is to occur, whether we like it or not, should result in a benefit for the wildlife. The incorporation of many bridges takes the footprint of the road above the ground allowing animals to move through the landscape without running the gauntlet of traffic. This appears to be an advantage for the environment, but does not automatically endorse the proposed upgrade.

# Tales from the Visitor Information Centre By Marié Boswarva

THE TYMES CLIMAT SUIT

Like many towns in the past where important minerals were found Herberton was once a large community, but when circumstances changed and this commodity either ran out or was no longer needed, they regressed to the tiny towns that are dotted all around Australia today.

Tin, found in 1880, was what changed Herberton from the home of the Bar Barrum Aboriginal people, to a mining town of 5,000 people operating and servicing 167 mines. When the war brought about the decline of tin mining, it destroyed the miners' lives, creating huge devastation. Although these changes such a short time after the creation of Herberton resulted in less population it has left intact many of the original buildings, which are still in, use today. Herberton is a 'Heritage Town', a place where the people who are interested in the past can see many old building, all in one place, still standing where they were originally built

As a nation, we are at an age where we are starting to recognize that our past artefacts are important and must be preserved and held for future generations. Herberton Information Centre came about because of that desire. With Herberton's reputation for valuing its past, many people of all ages were handing over their own personal history for safekeeping. It soon became apparent that something official must be created to store and display these precious relics. You can see them now in the new Information Centre, housed in the original Hardware Store. The Volunteer Ambassadors there will be delighted to share their knowledge with you.

Walking along the town peeking inside the old stores, you won't find many modernly run businesses, but contents as gentle and soothing and as old world as the buildings themselves. No blaring music or feeling of being rushed assault you as you enter. The Friends of the Animals Store has 2nd hand and new clothing. Nothing modern though, hand knitted beanies from the needles of the elderly, gifted women in the area will not only delight the eye and the senses but will bring back a lost feeling of mothers who were always home waiting in the kitchen for your return from school with milk, biscuits and warm hugs.

The Fine Art Gallery & Black & White Photography is still in the setting up stage, but we saw some of the strikingly beautiful photos, soon to be on display.

Roy Jakes of The Camera & Photography Museum is a confessed cameraholic. Roy used to be an intelligence officer in Korea, where his already deep interest in the workings of cameras accelerated and broadened into the history of spy cameras. Those of you who visit who already have a passion for old cameras will fluctuate between immense joy and envy at Roy's incredible collection. For those of you,



like me, who thought that a camera was just one of the unfathomable things that tourists seem to drag around everywhere to take hundreds of pictures that are later stored in deep drawers never to be seen again once the initial excitement of the journey has passed — will be AMAZED!!

As a kid I was given a Box Brownie, my brother used to develop and print my pictures in the bathroom. My memories are of tiny back and white photos so small that at times it was hard to recognize who was actually in them. My interest quickly waned, and the changes in cameras as well as the pictures they produced was a part of the changing technologies that have completely escape my notice, I was plainly - not interest. I didn't think that a private collection of camera would hold my attention longer than half a minute. But as Roy showed us these astounding camera, many from the 1800s, and told about their history and demonstrated their capabilities I was pulled in deeper and deeper into the shop, spellbound. Modern camera may have more bells and whistles, but the clarity of the photos still being produced from these ancient dinosaurs rival anything that the latest cameras can produce and are exhibited all around Australia. For an unusual memory of the museum, have your photos taken in the shop setting.

There are other past treasures on display for those that have different interest, so drop in, but give yourself plenty of time — you'll need it.

As you continue to walk down the street everywhere are "photos post", an ingenious idea of photographs showing the past, whilst looking at the same scene, in the present.

Risley's ALa Carte Restaurant is another restaurant in the Tablelands with a reputation of having the finest of foods.

The Royal Hotel may not be the oldest building in the town, that privilege goes to the library, but it has had a continuous liquor licence longer than any other pub in Australia, and is one of the two remaining pubs in the area, where there used to be many [what would you expect from the world's biggest beer drinker!].

Another speciality of the town is their unusual focus on the role of pioneer women, something that history

usually chooses to forget. Good on you Herberton!!

Catering for the early bird tourist that may wander into town and not know what to do until the community finally wakes up and gets going, is an absorbing history and minerals display in the library. It is open from 7am – 10pm, 7 days a week, just push open the door.

Herberton's mining history with its stories of intrigue, bravery and determination is a testimonial to the lone, little Aussie battler as well as the guts of the Chinese men who migrated to Australia in search of gold. Take the newly constructed walks in the mining area and see the old machinery that still stands there today. Or just take the walks for the pleasure, everything is colour coded, making it easy to find your way there and back.

We had been invited for lunch by Val at Green Springs Farm Stay. Built in 1938 it had come into disrepute somewhat during World War 2 when it had been used as a whorehouse come rehabilitation for soldiers, later a cleaner image emerged housing a Naturopath, later still a farm. It has been run as a family farm stay and restaurant for the last 3 1/2 years and children and tourist from the cities loved the opportunity to mix with and feed the many farm animals both small and large, as well as get to know some of the local wildlife. Sadly for the visitors that have enjoyed Val's food and country hospitality and would wish to return, from now on the facilities will only be open for group bookings. With this in mind we especially appreciate Val's country hospitality and the delicious lunch of soup, open sandwiches AND strawberries and cream.

We locals may still think that
Herberton is just another tiny town,
easily dismissed and forgotten, but tin
from this area is the reason Smithfied
in Cairns exists. So take a trip to the
birth place of Cairns, I guarantee that
even if the history of the area doesn't
interest you, talking with the locals
will bring you a pleasure all of its
own. Herberton's people, like many
in our small towns, are the real dinki
di country folks, full of knowledge and
kindness with time to spend enjoying
your company as much as you will
enjoy theirs.

"My dear, why don't we invite success"? Their daughter -in-law was listening from the other corner of the house.


She jumped in with her own suggestion: "Would it not be better to invite love?





# Wait a While FUNDS FOR STORM DAMAGE **REPAIRS IN MAREEBA**



The Beattie Government has approved a grant of more than \$4.36 million to the Mareeba

Shire Council to help meet the cost of natural disaster damaged restoration works caused by Cyclone Beni, Minister for Local Government and Planning, Nita Cummingham and the Premier's Parliamentary Secretary in Far North Queensland. Dr Lesley Clark announced today.

Dr Clark said funding of \$1,364,028 was provided under the Commonwealth. State Natural Disaster Relief Arrangements [NDRA] to provide the Council with financial assistance for the cost of restoring damaged pubic assets.

"I am pleased to see funding for muchneeded restoration to public assets in the Mareeba Shire area, following the damage that was caused

by flooding and cyclone activity early this year. The Mareeba Shire Council will also contribute \$103.000 from their won revenue towards restoring submergence damage," Dr Clark said.

Mrs Cunningham said to date, more than \$263 million has been allocated in NDRA grants to various councils following widespread flooding and cyclone activity that occurred through Queensland from November 1999 through to February 2003.

"Natural Disaster Relief Arrangements provided essential assistance to councils for restoration of public facilities and assets.

NFTS ensures that the State's infrastructure is restores appropriately to minimize disruption to local communities," she said.



WEAVE STORIES TOGETHER

Kuranda residents are invited to a local book launch at twilight this Friday to celebrate an unusual creative collaboration between two Kuranda residents. Mirrors is a book of Michael Quinn's poetic reflections on his personal journey through the arc of human history, and his musings on love and loss.

These ruminations have been collected together in one edition and beautifully illustrated by Kuranda art teacher lan Whittaker. Drawing on the ancient craft of cord binding, lan has made a limited edition of only 40 books, each handbound with brightly coloured fabrics, with original artworks and an etched copper nameplate.

Mirrors is reflective but no two books are alike. There is a palpable mutual respect in this artistic collaboration between Michael and Ian that comes through in the attention to detail in each individually bound book.

This kind of handmade book is reminiscent of the tradition of artists' books or journals, where important letters, quotes from guiding philosophers and spontaneous illustrations are explored for layers of meaning. These timeless books inevitably become collectors items. Quinn's poems, prose pieces, and sharp observations are a form of travelogue through life and the cosmos, beginning even before his own birth when he pieces together the nature of his parent's courtship, while contemplating the cycle of life and death. Michael Quinn has been a regular storyteller and performance poet at a number of festivals around the north, and his recording of Masquerade at the Love Club has featured on ABC Radio's Poetica program. Mantic Poets: spoken word therapy is a CD of performance works with other Kuranda poets

Over a decade ago, he worked closely with the Kuranda's few remaining Djabugay speakers in an effort to salvage the endangered language, collaborating with local people in writing a dictionary and textbooks and Bulurra: Storywaters, a book of Djabuganydji story lore. Michael Quinn and Ian Whittaker would like to invite all their friends, as well as the simply curious, to the twilight launch this Friday 31 October from 5.30pm at the Kuranda Hotel dining room. Dramatic readings will begin from 6pm sharp, assisted by Janice Starck and Eve Stafford





# Remiltons Hotel

I am trying to complete a history of the Howard Smith shipping line and wonder if there is anyone who had add to my knowledge of an interesting diversification that the company undertook in the 1920's. Howard Smith then operated passenger ships such as the CANBERRA, COOMA and BOMBALA and included many tourists and quite naturally looked to develop their involvement further. What I have so far can be summarised thus :-

Howard Smith together with the AUSN and Burns Philp made a move into the Hotel business in North Queensland when they joined forces and purchased Remilton's Hotel at Kuranda. Sitting proud on top of the Barron Gorge and quite one of the sights to see when visiting Cairns, tourists could catch the train to Kuranda, where the journey was in part through the wild and majestic Barron Gorge. The Hotel needed renovation and the original premises were to be extended,

and were to be fully opened in July 1925. Accommodation at the hotel would be doubled by the work put in hand. The idea of taking over the Hotel had been brought to Howard Smith by Mr.Rowe, the former Second Steward of the CANBERRA who had purchased the Hotel in 1924 and found he lacked the capital to develop the premises to take full advantage of the nearby Atherton Tablelands.

Does anyone know what happened to the Hotel and if there is a photograph or drawing of this establishment. I can only presume that it closed or was sold in the Depression as there is seemingly no further detail listed by Howard Smith or any other sources that I have consulted.

If anyone can shed any further light on this it would be very helpful and I thank them in advance for all assistance.
