CADAGHI TREES

DOUGLAS TRACK

A small grove of magnificent Cadaghi trees on Douglas Track in the Speewah area is under threat. Water main and road construction to a proposed park residential development in the area may well result in the destruction of these trees, which are on the edge of the road reserve.

Local residents who successfully petitioned the council last year to have the trees protected were surprised and disappointed when they learned recently that the council had withdrawn its support, claiming it had no legal power to protect the trees. If trees on a surveyed road cannot be protected by the council, it seems no one can save them. Only strong support from Kuranda residents can make council re-examine its stand.

The trees would appear to have grown in a more open situation than they now inhabit, as the largest specimen has wide spreading branches. Possibly it grew when the area was cleared as an entry to a homestead on what is now Rosebud Farm. While this puts the age of these trees at a relatively youthful century at best, their size and accessibility makes them worthy of preservation.

Both ARK and the Kuranda Environment Association have supported protection for these cadaghi trees - perhaps more expressions of support will now convince council to reassess this issue. 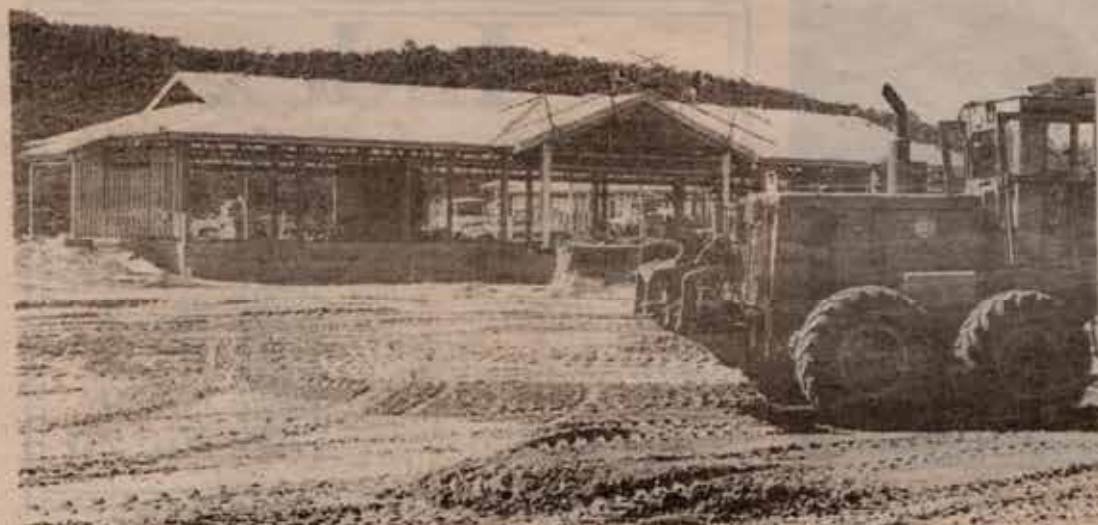

A public meeting held at the Kuranda Rainforest Resort on 2 August was well attended by residents of Kuranda. The meeting was part of the review currently being undertaken by LePage and Company, Tourism Consultants, as they work towards developing a long range marketing plan for the village. Local business people and residents used this opportunity to express their ideas and visions for the future development of Kuranda. Lead Consultant, Stephen Le Page, put forward some new ideas for discussion and these were well received by those at the meeting. NATIVE TITLE

from Sue Robertson

David Byrne from the Cape York Land Council addressed "Politics in the Pub" last Friday, 15th August. His thoughtful and cogently presented address, filled in many details in the history leading up to and beyond the Mabo and Wik High Court decisions. What follows is a summary of David's main points. He began with the issue of reconciliation and quoted Governor Phillip's remarks about Bennelong at some length. Koories were not at first interested in dealing with the invaders. Bennelong was captured and jailed at the very beginning of this tortured relationship. Aboriginal civilisation is the world's oldest, the only one not ripped up by its own conflicts. The Mabo decision brought us back into the fold of the Commonwealth, recognising, as other Commonwealth countries do, a form of native title. Wik people have been winning in the courts since the 1970s but their rights are not yet assured. Native title has not been extinguished but agreement is being prevented. The recent decision was based on the legal distinction between common law and statutory leases. Farmers thought they had exclusive possession as may be the case in common law, but under the statutes which governs this lease, they have only exclusive rights to pastoral functions.

Both Queensland and Federal governments have failed to consult in any meaningful way with Aboriginal people. David summarised the Coalition amendments as preferring billions of dollars in compensation rather than allowing any rights to co-exist or negotiation to occur even where landowners are willing, as many are on Cape York. It aims to destroy the historical agreement already made there between pastoralists, Aboriginal people, and conservationists. The amendments will not bring certainty. The problem is not going to go away. Davis encouraged local Djabugay people to continue in the struggle for the Barron Gorge. A little more in the Kuranda Newspaper. A good suggestion from the audience was that we all make our own negotiations with Aboriginal people where they have an interest in the land we are occupying. It may be something as simple as collecting a certain grass used for weaving bags. These agreements could be so easily embraced as an opportunity for better understanding.

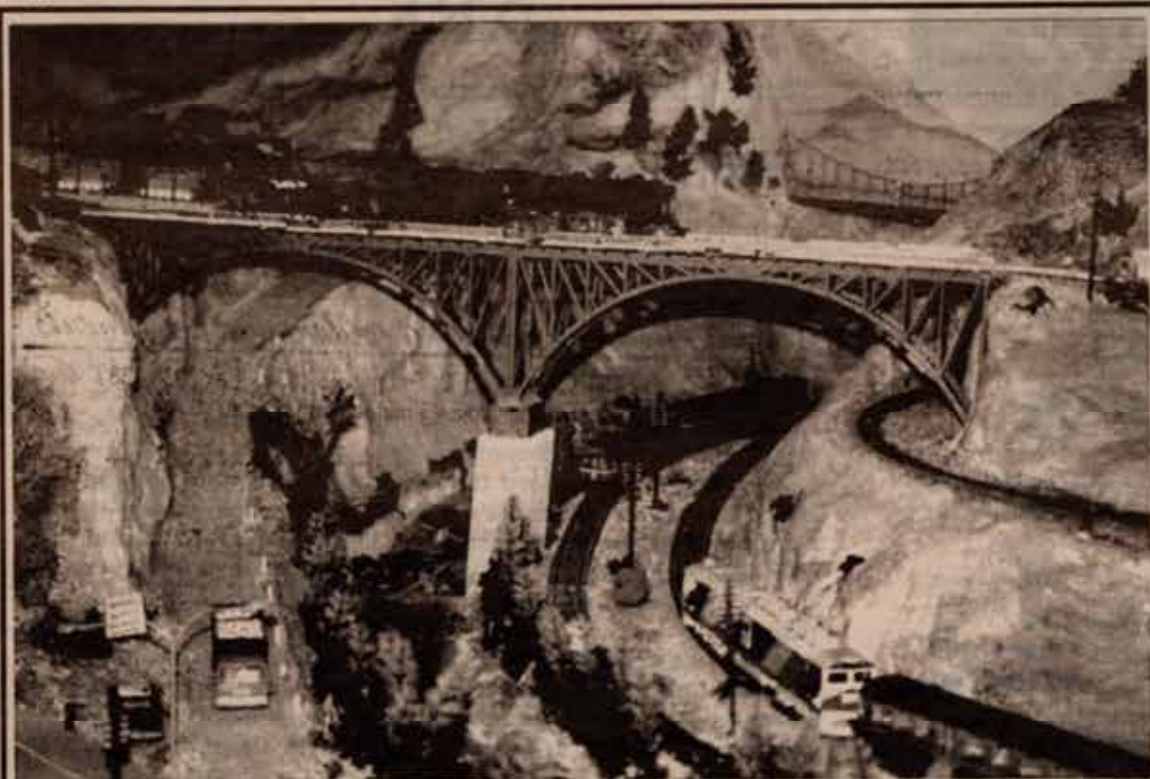
Mayor Chris Lewis outlined Council's final decisions. The major recommendation (a bus parking station on Arara Street near the railway) has unfortunately been accepted by Council. There was no disguising ARK's disappointment at this decision which ARK opposed on environmental, social and economic grounds. The implications for residents and users of Barang Street are also very significant. The Mayor said that Council felt that "buses were no longer an issue" in Kuranda because few people other than ARK had protested against the proposal and the public meeting to discuss the issue had been poorly attended. ARK considers this bad reasoning on the part of Council and believes that people are just fed up with complaining and wondering if Council ever really listens anyway.

What do you think? Let ARK know, let Council know and attend the next ARK meeting when the Kuranda Traffic Study will be BUSINESS ON NOTICE.

TrainLand is the second lease on life for a model train layout which was known previously as "Mareeba Trainland" and had been painstakingly constructed over many years by the Turner family at Mareeba. The display's relocation to Kuranda recently received the green light by the Mareeba Shire Council, much to the delight of new owner, Gunnar Neander.

This model train will be an attraction for tourists and locals alike and a 'must see' for every train enthusiast" says Gunnar who himself has been interested in trains for most of his life. "It is a very large, detailed layout with many trains, moving parts, action scenes and new surprises". ORGANIC GARDENING

I hope many readers are enjoying the organic citrus and the green vegies from their veg gardens - With a modest daily watering and liquid manure on cabbages, lettuce, celery, chives and basil, I am able to feed me and friends. Mandarins are now all picked and resting in a frig - not too cold. If left on the tree they go dry or get attacked by the sucking moth. The trees are putting on new growth so it is best to prune them before that happens so the tree does not waste energy. Grapefruit are still on the trees though I have given away hundreds, there are still hundreds on the trees. Flowering gingers and heliconia plants are free to anyone able to dig them out. Do nourish and mulch your citrus after pruning and picking all the fruits. My Jade Vine has lots of glorious long trusses of green flowers.

DYPSIS BARONII. The dypsis pictured is about 1.5 meters tall and is 7yrs old. As can be seen it is about to flower. Grown in full sun it has the unusual habit of the stem dividing into two. STATION NEWS:

August has been much the same as the past months with approximately 40 call-outs responded to. I would like to offer my sympathy to those families who suffered personal loss during this period. I have had some enquiries about First Aid courses. Unfortunately with staffing levels and relief duties as they are, only very limited courses can be offered at Kuranda. The next one should be during the first two weeks of October. This course should already be filled with folk that have been waiting for some time and I will confirm course times and dates with them shortly. TREVORS TIP:

ASTHMA:

Because of the continuing cold and changeable weather as well as the onset of spring with the blossoms and allergic reactions I thought I would recap this section on Asthma.

Asthma is a condition in which the air passages to the lungs become narrowed by muscle spasm, swelling of the mucous membrane lining the lungs and increased mucus production in the lungs. The airways become narrowed and the victim has difficulty breathing. Air is trapped in the lungs because the victim cannot easily breathe out.

In Australia an average of 800 deaths per year result from asthma.

CAUSES:

Many different factors can trigger an asthma attack, including:

- * Exposure to a sudden change in the weather, especially cold or wet conditions.
- * Infections, especially respiratory infection
- * Allergic reaction to food, pollen or an insect sting.
- * Emotional stress
- * Exercise or physical activity, especially when there is no management plan for medication or pre-exercise warm ups.

SYMPTOMS and SIGNS:

The onset of an attack can be recognised by one or more of the following:

- * Shortness of breath (especially when talking)
- * Wheezing when exhaling, but REMEMBER not all asthma patient wheeze
- * Dry or moist cough
- * Thirst due to loss of water vapour from the lungs
- * Increasing pulse rate
- * Drawing in of the spaces between the ribs and above the collar bone with the effort of breathing
- * Cyanosis (Bluish discolouration often seen around the mouth and extremities)
- * Exhaustion
- * An inability to talk
- * Collapse

TREATMENT:

- * Assist the victim to take any prescribed medication promptly
 - * Rest the patient from physical activity
 - * Encourage quiet normal breathing
 - * Sit with arms supported on a table or bench to make breathing easier
- Call for Immediate Ambulance Medical Treatment on 000

KISC ALCOHOL & DRUG BULLETIN DEPRESSION - PART 1

This month we start a series of articles about depression, a condition commonly experienced by many people themselves, or by someone close to them. Rates of depression have increased over the last 50 years and are notably higher in people born after WWII than before.

We all experience "the blues" or feel "down in the dumps" periodically - this is a part of the natural rhythm of life for how would we be aware of happiness if there was no unhappiness? So to some extent "depression" is a normal part of life - when does it become a "problem" that prevents us from living a satisfying life?

Some symptoms to be aware of include:

*inability to concentrate *totally lacking in energy *constant headaches

*neck and back pains *loss of appetite *tummy or bowel problems

*loss of interest in sex *inability to feel happiness or joy in things that normally cheer you up *feelings of worthlessness or guilt about past misdeeds much of the time *thoughts of death or suicide.

The most important thing to do if you can say 'yes' to most of the above is to talk to someone who is supportive and willing to listen, and then seek professional advice.

Next month we will look at types of depression, and some myths surrounding this mood disorder. Future articles will look at chemical and natural approaches to dealing with depression.

2. Install dehumidifiers and ionisers to aid in reducing humidity to 50% and to clean the air particles.
3. Keep all air ducting regularly cleaned.
4. Vent steamy bathrooms and clothes dryers to the outside.
5. Cleanup the effected areas around you using a specialist cleaning service familiar with techniques of mould and spore eradication.

A THOUGHT FOR SEPTEMBER

This month we open our Bibles at St Marks Gospel, Chapter 7 and read verses 1 to 23. Religion is a thing of many levels and many facets. We can observe people with a religion that is very strict, full of rules and directions, unforgiving. We know of a religion that is mere sentimentality having no standards accepting everything. A certain kind of Christianity expressed fervent concern for a human soul without paying the slightest attention to human society. Another form of Christianity is deeply committed to social issues but has not the slightest interest in prayer or public worship. There are two words that describe the many varieties and gradations of such stances. We speak of intrinsic and extrinsic religion. The sound of the words hints at their meaning -- extrinsic religion is demonstrated by and deeply concerned about external things. In this kind of religion outward observance is very important. On the other hand intrinsic religion is concerned with the internal life of the person. What is really going on inside? What are the persons real motivations? But life is never as neatly packaged as this. Every persons faith is a mingling of intrinsic and extrinsic, yet if we are looking for a healthy faith in someone, we try to see if their religious practices - worship, prayer, discipline and observance are consistent with their attitudes, statements and actions toward others and society. This Passage allows us to see a moment of harsh confrontation between Jesus and the Pharisees and Scribes -- two groups in society at that time which were very committed to outward observances of religion. These people express concerns that Jesus and His followers do not observe certain accepted practices of the faith. Jesus' response is uncompromising. He emphasises that any moral and spiritual defilement of our life come from within us. In saying this our Lord is not dismissing the worth of external actions in religion. He was attaching an attitude that gives priority to outward religious observance and neglects inner motivations. Of prime importance for Jesus is the spirituality deep down inside us. If that interior spirituality is not a reflection of His will and spirit, then our outward observance no matter how disciplined and faultless will reflect a lovelessness far from His love. If on the other hand our inner spirituality is a true reflection of our Lord's spirit then it will emerge in actions and attitudes which He wishes us to show. For Jesus inner motivation takes precedence over outer observance in the make up of our spirituality.

 "This is the changeless Faith of God, eternal in the past, eternal in the future."



Report: Macintosh Platform ROI-Friendly

Buy a Mac, improve your ROI. That's the finding of a study to be published in August by high-technology market researcher Gistics Inc. in Larkspur, Calif. The company's research also suggests IT leaders emphasize ROI over simply driving down the total cost of ownership. The independently funded report claims Mac users in the digital-media production sector, such as advertising, marketing, and Web development, produce on average \$26,441 more annual revenue, and \$14,488 more net profit per person than Windows users of comparable skill engaged in similar work activities. The revenue differential enables Mac-based digital-media production studios to achieve payback on desktop systems in 4.59 months, the report says, while Windows NT-based firms require 12.56 months to recoup. The researchers say they polled 30,226 media professionals and 10,000 media-producing firms before compiling their results. "We were surprised," says Stephan M.H. Braitman, Gistics editor-in-chief and director of professional publications. "But basically, the bottom line is, if you want to make a profit as a media-production studio, large or small, buy Mac, because the return on investment is clear." Braitman says the Mac's ROI differential transitions well to other, more mundane computing sectors, such as word processing, spreadsheets, and database services. "A lot of these results are applicable across a wider spectrum of the industry," he says.



TIPS OF THE MONTH For Win95

Speedier Swap File for W95

Go to Control Panel to the System Properties box and click on the Virtual Memory button. Usually Windows 95 does a very good job of managing virtual memory, also known as the swap file. But if you use memory-intensive apps like Microsoft Office 97 or Adobe Photoshop, a few judicious adjustments in Virtual Memory may speed things up. If you have more than one physical drive, put the swap file on your fastest hard drive. First defragment the drive where the swap file will be located. To minimize swap setup time, set the minimum and maximum size of the swap file to the same number, approximately 2.5 to 3 times the size of your main memory. For example, if you have 16MB of RAM, set it to 48MB. Click on OK and restart Windows to kick in your new swap settings.

Running Older Applications

Create Compatibility. Run Win 3.1 apps with a little help. Windows 95 ships with a little-known utility that lets you run renegade DOS and Windows 3.1 programs in Windows 95. The key to making these programs work with Windows 95 is using the settings stored in the [Compatibility] section of the Win.ini file. If you open C:\Windows\Win.ini, you'll see entries like these:

[Compatibility]
ACAD=0x8000
AMIPRO=0x04000010

Each entry tells Windows 95 how to force the program to work—for example, "Lie about Windows version number," or "Give application more stack space." Fortunately, you don't need to memorize these settings. Simply click on File, Run, type in MKCOMPAT, click on File, Choose Program, and check off the appropriate restrictions.

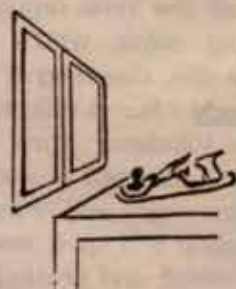
