

NEWS FROM THE NEIGHBOURHOOD CENTRE

Hi Everyone I think we can safely say that Winter is behind us and Spring has sprung! What a beautiful time of the year and it's even better at the Neighbourhood Centre: come in and say "G'day" if you haven't caught up with us for a while.

I thought I'd talk this month about an issue close to many people's hearts — bringing up kids, particularly teenagers and particularly in these times of changing values, expectations and social norms. Not so long ago, it was fairly simple to raise our children: by and large we just did what our parents had done with us. No big deal: we seemed to have turned out OK. Why doesn't it work like that any more you may ask? The main reason seems to be the huge and rapid change that has literally engulfed us, especially in the last two generations. Many more families are headed by a sole parent as couples choose not to stay in poor relationships; finding a job after school no longer means following in Dad's footsteps; the technological age makes the whole world more accessible but conversely, renders us less significant, less in control of our future, less confident of our place in the big scheme of things.

As parents, we often look at our kids and think " I'm going to make it better for them than I had it". And unfortunately, this is where we come undone! To grow up into mature, responsible, fully functioning adults necessitates struggle, challenge, mistakes and risk-taking. It's important that we as parents don't make it too easy for them, don't pamper them in their learning from the big school of life! How otherwise will our young people learn to handle their own lives and their own problems, make their own wise choices and experience the consequences of their own behaviour? Needless to say, as our kids "practice" for adulthood, they need to do so in a family environment, which is supportive and encouraging, affirming and positive. Most of all, we need to trust our teenagers, show faith

We now have Council approval to erect two large map signs at the train/Skyrail apron. These will go a long way to informing visitors about where places are in the town and how to get there.

Caring for customers and rainforest

Ergon Energy's undertaking a delicate balancing act on the Kuranda Range, with workers halfway through an eight-week project in the midst of World Heritage Rainforest. Their challenge – to protect power lines from tree damage, while minimising any impact on the sensitive environment.

Regional Operations Manager, Geoff Bowes, said Ergon Energy's ongoing Vegetation Management Program was aimed at improving the safety and reliability of the Far North's power supply by creating a buffer zone between trees and power lines. "Vegetation brushing against or falling on power lines used to be one of the major causes of power loss in the Far North," Mr. Bowes said. "However our Vegetation Management Program is paying dividends, with a 71% drop in power losses due to vegetation over the past seven years," he said. "With work recently completed in the Edge Hill and Northern Beaches areas, our vegetation maintenance contractors, VEMCO Pty Ltd, are now working to ensure trees and other vegetation don't put Kuranda, Caravonica and Kamerunga's power supply at risk." In addition to improving reliability for customers, the program has an important safety focus. "If vegetation comes into contact with power lines there's always the chance it could bring them down, posing a risk to public safety," Mr. Bowes said. "It's particularly important we do this work now, ahead of the start of the cyclone season later this year."

Member for Barron River, Lesley Clar, k said she was pleased to see first-hand the extent of Ergon Energy's commitment to both its customers and the environment. "The Caravonica area in particular has lost power several times in recent years due to trees and branches falling onto power lines, so it's great to see Ergon Energy working hard to keep the lights on," Dr Clark said. "There's no doubt the Kuranda range is a one of the most visually appealing parts of the Far North, and it's an important piece of rainforest and Cassowary habitat. But we need to balance the needs of the environment and the needs of our residents, so it's great to see Ergon Energy working towards that goal," she said.

- "Snoopervising" homework by asking: how much has to be done, when is it due, checking it, nagging them and reminding them

The Christening

It was a beautiful church. Warm sandstone like bread rising in the sun. From the inside stained-glass windows glowed, illuminating various translucent apostles. The building must have been at least one hundred years old, styled in the ornate architecture of yesteryear.

But the congregation's attention was elsewhere. For, early in the service, a bird had snuck in. Clad in riotous plumage – possibly a rosella of some sort – it fluttered from rafter, scattering shards of red, green and golden light in its wake. Or sometimes it took in the length of the church in a single spectacular swoop.

At various intervals, the bird let out raucous but somewhat musical shrieks, all of them inappropriately timed. It was difficult to ascertain whether these shrill interruptions were attempts at participation or if the bird was oblivious to the human activity below, lost in an ecstatic avian joi de vivre. As the echoes of each birdcall resounded from the rafters, the reverend would glance upwards in a stifled mixture of amusement and annoyance. Some parishioners appeared to be concerned that they might receive a christening of quite a different kind.

How is it that several octaves of organ, enlivened by 240 volts and accompanied by an entire congregation, could be drowned out by the joyful song of a single bird? How is it that several hundred tons of stone, timber and stained glass, erected to glorify God could be so easily outshone by the unselfconscious flight of a tiny-feathered creature born effortlessly from an egg?

We strive for God's favour or try to earn karma, all the while forgetting that every day is a miracle, every heartbeat a gift. We try to manufacture magic by ritual and tradition; relying on human artifice to reach the divine. But the magic awaits us in every moment of our lives – inexplicable and undeserved.

Survive a heart attack

Let's say it is 6:15 pm. and you are driving home alone, after an unusually hard day on the job. You're really tired, upset and frustrated. Suddenly you start experiencing a sharp pain in your chest that starts radiating out into your arm and up into your jaw. You are only about 10 k from the closest hospital, but unfortunately you don't know if you'll be able to make it that far.

What can you do?

You've been trained to do CPR but the guy that taught the course neglected to tell you how to perform it on yourself. Since many people are alone when they suffer a heart attack, this article seemed in order.

Without help, the person whose heart stops beating properly and who begins to feel faint, has only about 10 seconds before losing consciousness. However, these victims can help themselves by coughing repeatedly and very vigorously. A deep breath should be taken before each cough, and the cough must be deep and prolonged, as when producing sputum from deep inside the chest. A breath and a cough must be repeated about every two seconds without letting up until help arrives, or until the heart is beating normally again. Deep breaths get oxygen into the lungs and coughing movements squeeze the heart and keep the blood circulating.

The squeezing pressure on the heart also helps it regain normal rhythm.

In this way, heart attack victims can get to a hospital.

The Dalai Lama has asked that the following practice be shared with as many people as possible
A group recently spent days visiting with the Dalai Lama focusing upon what they believe the five most important questions to be considered moving into the new millennium. The five questions were

- 1. How do we address the widening gap between rich and poor?
- 2. How do we protect the earth?
- 3. How do we educate our children?
- 4. How do we help Tibet and other oppressed countries and peoples of the world?
- 5. How do we bring spirituality (deep caring for one another) through all disciplines of life? The Dalai Lama said all five questions fall under the last one. If we have true compassion in our hearts, our children will be educated wisely, we will care for the earth, those who "have not" will be cared for. The group asked the Dalai Lama, "Do you think loving on the planet is increasing or staying the same?" His response: "My experience leads me to believe that love IS increasing." He shared a simple practice that will increase loving and compassion in the world.

He asked everyone in the group to share it with as many people as they can. The Practice:

- 1. Spend 5 minutes at the beginning of each day remembering we all want the same things (to be happy and be loved) and we are all connected to one another.
- Spend 5 minutes -- breathing in cherishing yourself; and, breathing out cherishing others. If you think about people you have difficulty cherishing, extend your cherishing to them anyway.
- 3. During the day extend that attitude to everyone you meet. Practice cherishing the "simplest" person (clerks, attendants, etc.), as well as the "important" people in your life; cherish the people you love and the people you dislike.
- 4. Continue this practice no matter what happens or what anyone does to you. These thoughts are very simple, inspiring and helpful. The practice of cherishing can be taken very deep if done wordlessly, allowing yourself to feel the love and appreciation that already exists in your heart.

THE RESURRECTION OF CHRIST

Question.---What the meaning resurrection after three days? Answer.---The resurrections of the Divine Manifestations are not of the body. All Their states, Their conditions, Their acts, the things They have established, Their teachings, Their expressions, Their parables and Their instructions have a spiritual and divine signification, and have no connection with material things. For example, there is the subject of Christ's coming from heaven: it is clearly stated in many places in the Gospel that the Son of man came from heaven, He is in heaven, and He will go to heaven. So in chapter 6 verse 38, of the Gospel of John it is written: "For I came down from heaven"; and also in verse 42 we find: "And they said, Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How is it then that he saith, I came down from heaven?" Also in John, chapter 3, verse 13: "And no man hath ascended up to heaven, but He that came down from heaven, even the Son of man which is in heaven." Observe that it is said, "The Son of man is in heaven," while at that time Christ was on earth. Notice also that it is said that Christ came from heaven, though He came from the womb of Mary, and His body was born of Mary. It is clear, then, that when it is said that the Son of man is come from heaven, this has not an outward but an inward signification; it is a spiritual, not a material, fact. The meaning is that though, apparently, Christ was born from the womb of Mary, in reality He came from heaven, from the centre of Sun of Reality, from the Divine World, and the Spiritual Kingdom. And as it has become evident that Christ came from the spiritual heaven of the Divine Kingdom. therefore, His disappearance under the earth for three days has an inner signification and is not an outward fact. In the same way, His resurrection from the interior of the earth is also symbolical; it is a spiritual and divine fact, and not material; and likewise His ascension to heaven is a spiritual

A Thought For September

The months Bible reading is from St Johns Gospel Chapter 6 Verses 51-58

Reading this sixth chapter of the Gospel of John is like wading out into deeper and deeper water until one either panics and wades back to the shore, or plunges in and swims out into the depths. Jesus is still involved in this long conversation with people around him. The strange event of the feeding of the five thousand is now well known, and it has triggered many reactions, some angry and distrustful. Jesus is dealing with these reactions.

Above all, he is trying to use the symbol of bread as a means of talking about the relationship between humanity and God. Many of those around him either cannot or will not understand. "The bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh." Suddenly and chillingly a new note is injected into the conversation. Up to now it has been about bread as the image of God's grace.

We are hungry. God supplies spiritual bread for us if we seek it from God. That is what everyone has been hearing, at least those who have been prepared to listen. But now Jesus names the cost of that spiritual bread. The cost is his own life. As we know, Jesus is referring to the actual physical threat to himself. But another truth is being communicated to us.

"Unless you eat ... and drink," says Jesus. Jesus is also telling us a fundamental truth about religious life. He is saying that we must fully internalize our religion before it can become grace to us. In other words, we must take Jesus, his words, his life, his pattern of response, into our own lives. One must blend with the other.

Many of us may know the Hymn "Breath on me breath of God", there in the heart of the hymn is a line that prays. "Until with thee I have one will to do and to endure." That is what It means to internalise the spirit of Our Lord. We take his spirit into our spirits. As Jesus spoke to the people around him, he used an image familiar to them from their history.

He spoke of manna, a kind of bread, which centuries before had appeared to their ancestors each dawn in the wilderness. The image familiar to us as Christians is that of the Eucharist. We act it out in a visible and tangible way when we come forward and reach up our hands for the broken bread of his body and the poured wine of his blood. As we do these outward actions, we also stretch out our spirits toward the spirit of Our Lord, and silently and simply ask Our Lord to come into us and live with us as we live out our daily lives.

If we invite him, he accepts our invitation. Our Lord may be the source of our grace, but the cost for him has been great.

and not material ascension. Beside these explanations, it has been established and proved by science that the visible heaven is a limitless area, void and empty, where innumerable stars and planets revolve.

Therefore, we say that the meaning of Christ's resurrection is as follows: the disciples were troubled and agitated after the martyrdom of Christ. The Reality of Christ, which signifies His teachings, His bounties, His perfection and His spiritual power, was hidden and concealed for two or three days after His martyrdom, and was not resplendent and manifest. No, rather it was lost, for the believers were few in number and were troubled and agitated. The Cause of Christ was like a lifeless body; and when after three days the disciples became assured and steadfast, and began to serve the Cause of Christ, and resolved to spread the divine teachings, putting his counsels into practice, and arising to serve Him, the Reality of Christ became resplendent and His bounty appeared; His religion found life; His teachings and His admonitions became evident and visible. In other words, the Cause of Christ was like a lifeless body until life and the bounty of the Holy Spirit surrounded it. Such is the meaning of the resurrection of Christ, and this was a true resurrection, but as the clergy have neither understood the meaning of the Gospels nor comprehended the symbols, therefore, it has been said that religion is in contradiction to science, and science is in opposition to religion, as, for example, this subject of the ascension of Christ with an elemental body to the visible heaven is contrary to the science of mathematics. But when the truth of this subject becomes clear, and the symbol is explained, science and in no way contradicts it; but, on the contrary, science and intelligence affirm it. HYDROPONIC GARDENING

The cooler weather has been very good for the garden. Peas really love it. I also have bush beans, which are more convenient then the climbing variety, you just pick them off a small bush. Chinese Cabbage or Wong Bok is thriving too. Rocket, lettuce and everything else has taken off. My truss tomato was a casualty to a large wallaby. But I think I have saved it. It is growing below the part where it was chewed off. It doesn't seem to have any of the usual tomato problems. The idea is to pick off the truss like you pick a bunch of bananas and they ripen gradually. I recently had an elderly gentleman inspect the garden. I showed him how to set it up and pointed out that you don't have to dig or weed and for the people with mobility problems hydroponic gardening is ideal. You don't have to have a huge garden, quite a few greens can be grown in boxes on a bench. It is better if the bench is made of steel mesh though to avoid rot. A RARE CHANCE TO GET AHEAD OF THE GAME

Saturday 20th September, 4.30pm at the Kuranda Medical Centre meeting room (corner Thongon and Barang Streets)

We'll take a close look at MAREEBA SHIRE'S NEW PLANNING SCHEME which has been written under THE INTEGRATED

PLANNING ACT to see if there are any omissions we think are important or any aspects of the plan we would like strengthened or changed. We'll be guided through the process by solicitors from the Environmental Defender's Office and a town planning consultant.

If the planning is right, there'll be controls on tree clearing and proper conditions on subdivisions in forested areas.

This planning document is especially important because it will be the bible for any large scale development in Myola.

An informed community is a strong one. Many of the errors of the past were allowed to happen because the community didn't understand the significance of decisions being made by an equally uninformed council. The Top of the Range subdivision is a prime example. The council of the day approved lot sizes for that subdivision that were inconsistent with the operating town plan. There's no doubt that error would not have occurred if it had been challenged by anyone in the community but it was allowed to proceed unchecked. The perfect crime right under our very noses!

So, Saturday 20th September, 4.30pm at the Kuranda Medical Centre meeting room is the name of the game.

A WALK THROUGH THE KURANDA ENVIROLINK WILDLIFE CORRIDOR (Kowrowa/Mantaka end) SATURDAY 6th SEPTEMPBER, 3PM.

We want to show you around the wildlife corridor so many of us have been working on for the past 5 years. The walk will take about 2 hours and is fairly easy. There are some rough spots and a couple of hills but there are several spots where we can arrange to pick you up when you've had enough. It'd be a shame to miss the easy bits because you don't feel you can make the more difficult bits.

We've timed it so that most workers who generally can't get to Saturday morning tree planting sessions can participate. You'll enjoy a running commentary—history, species identification, which species have done well and why species were selected for different spots. You'll learn about the various techniques we used. At the end of the walk, we'll enjoy a snack and a hot or cold drink.

Just bring yourself, your family, sensible shoes, a hat and a water bottle. Leave the rest up to us.

We'll meet along Myola-Oakforest Road between Boyles Road and Lower Kowrowa. There's ample off-road car parking. Look out for the KURANDA EnviroCare signs, two Land for Wildlife signs and rural number 265.

Report on Envirofiesta 2003



While not the first reggae show to be held at t e Kuranda Amphitheatre by a long shot, organiser Morgyn Quinn claims this will be the first of an ongoing annual event for Kuranda and reggae lovers of the world. A fan of Reggae and roots music, Quinn says his visit to the Caribbean gave him an insight into Rastafarian culture.

"Beneath the surface of thumping reggae dancehalls I found that the Rasta philosophy was based on a system of love and respect - for all races and all species of life. I want to promote this kind of thing at a gig - where black and white and all races can play, dance and appreciate music together." Responding to 'why Kuranda?' and 'Why a Reggae Festival?' Quinn had these words to say

"Originally I was planning on smaller scale show for my band Hot Rubber Glove and Promiscuous - a funk/Latin/reggae ensemble who are touring up the coast with us from Brisbane - but friends in Kuranda kept talking me out of it. So I thought alright then, lets invite this band and that band and what the **#C&/. Let's make it a festival!

Kuranda Amphitheatre is the best outdoor venue in Australia that I've seen. I think the experience of uplifting positive music at such a magic location can not be beaten. I've been to so many mind-blowing concerts, theatre productions and even raves at the amphitheatre - I'm relieved it's open again.

Some of you will be familiar with Hot Rubber Glove; perhaps from shows at Frogs the Spring Fair or the Raggamuffin concerts we did at the Amphitheatre in past years. 





It was a great show and everyone really enjoyed it.




Taipans Clinic
